Knowing of your concerns about the proposed Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) stormwater management regulations by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), I wanted to take a quick minute to let you know that I, along with my colleague Congressman Charlie Dent of Lebanon, am working to address this on the federal level.

Attached please find a letter that Rep. Dent and I have sent to the House Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Subcommittee, which has jurisdiction over EPA's budget, requesting that language prohibiting the EPA from mandating that municipalities be responsible for stormwater beyond the "conveyance system" they own and operate be incorporated into the FY13 Interior Appropriations bill. The Subcommittee is in the process of drafting this bill and has indicated a willingness to consider this language and I will certainly keep you posted as this effort develops.

I am hopeful that this language is ultimately enacted so that cash-strapped municipalities across the Commonwealth will not face undue financial hardship as a result of overreach by the EPA with respect to the management of stormwater.

Dear Chairmen Rogers and Simpson:

Over the past few months, municipalities in our Congressional Districts and across the Commonwealth of PA have become increasingly concerned about the potential administrative and cost impacts of proposed Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) stormwater management regulations by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

At present, it appears PA's Department of Environmental Protection and the EPA have entered into a verbal agreement that municipalities will <u>not</u> be responsible for stormwater within "urbanized areas" in the municipality and only be responsible for stormwater activities within "conveyance systems" that are under municipal control and operation. However, we have nothing in writing from EPA to this effect and many are concerned that the EPA may move in the future to apply these regulations to stormwater within "urbanized areas." This would, in turn, make municipalities responsible for all stormwater management within their borders, even on all private property, and compel them to raise taxes enormously to meet the burden of such a federal mandate.

Since you are in the process of crafting the FY13 Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations bill, we would therefore like to work with you on including language to prohibit the EPA from mandating that municipalities be responsible for stormwater beyond the "conveyance system" they own and operate.

We thank you for your consideration of this request and look forward to working with you on drafting policies that ensure our municipalities are not required to shoulder an inordinate and unreasonable burden in the management of stormwater in the future.

## AMENDMENT TO INTERIOR AND ENVIRONMENT APPROPRIATIONS BILL OFFERED BY MR. DENT OF PENNSYLVANIA

At the end of the bill (before the spending reduction account), insert the following:

1 SEC. . Section 402(p)(3) of the Federal Water 2 Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1342(p)(3)) is amended 3 by adding at the end the following new subparagraph: "(C) LIMITATION.—The Administrator or 4 5 a State may not require a municipality oper-6 ating a municipal separate storm sewer system 7 serving a population of less than 100,000 to ob-8 tain a permit under this subsection for a dis-9 charge that---"(i) 10 is composed entirely of 11 stormwater from a facility that is not 12 owned or operated by the municipality; and 13 "(ii) does not enter into the municipal 14 separate storm sewer system.".

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
