MINUTES OF MEETING MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS JUNE 25, 2012

Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera called the executive session to order at 7:15 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Robert Birch, Michael Fox and Joseph Walsh. Supervisor Jeffrey McDonnell was absent. Also in attendance were Lawrence Gregan, Frank R. Bartle, Esquire and Bruce Shoupe. Three Zoning Hearing Board matters were discussed.

Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera called the work session meeting to order at 7:38 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Robert Birch, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Frank R. Bartle Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Bruce Shoupe, Planning Consultant Ken Amey, Richard McBride, Esquire and Deborah Rivas.

Richard McBride, Esquire, representing the developer, David Cutler Group, presented revised site plans proposed for the Montgomery Walk/Enclave at Montgomery development. Mr. McBride reported that the Cutler Group was requesting the revision because the original plan had additional middle units which were not selling. In addition, with the decrease in commercial activity, the revised plan reduced the commercial area along Route 309 from five acres to one acre. The proposed revisions included increasing the number of units by 52, increasing the percentage of units that are age restricted from 50% to 64%, increasing the number of age restricted housing units to assist in using and financially supporting the clubhouse and facilities, reducing the commercial area from 5 acres to 1 acre and reducing the area of public roadways to be dedicated to the Township. Mr. McBride stated that if the Board was acceptable to the revisions, the plan would proceed through the Township's staff and consultant reviews and come before the Board for formal approval. The Board was in favor of the revised plan being submitted for formal consideration.

Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera called the regular action meeting to order at 8:08 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Robert Birch, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Frank R. Bartle, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Ken Amey,





Russell Dunleavy, Judith Stern Goldstein, Kevin Johnson, Richard Brady, Scott Bendig, Bruce Shoupe, Rick Lesniak, Ann Shade, Stacy Crandell, Vickie Zidek, Rich Grier and Deb Rivas.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Chimera called for public comment from the audience and there was none.

Frank R. Bartle, Esquire reported that the Board met in an executive session earlier in the evening at 7:15 p.m. for approximately 20 minutes. Mr. Bartle reported that there were three Zoning Hearing Board matters discussed which included an application for John and Gwen Muhlig for 733 Bethlehem Pike, an application for Alpha Consulting Engineers, Inc. for 27 Airport Square and an application for Janet and Michael Maleski of 104 Major Drive. Mr. Bartle reported that all of these matters are legitimate subjects of executive session pursuant to Pennsylvania's Sunshine Law.

Chairman Chimera made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 11, 2012 Board meeting and Supervisor Michael Fox seconded the motion. The minutes of the meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Public Information Coordinator, Stacy Crandell, reported that the Odyssey of the Mind program in the schools is an international program that challenges teams of five to seven students to use their creativity and problem-solving skills to solve short-term "spontaneous" problems and a long-term problem that ranges from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics. Ms. Crandell introduced the very successful teams and coaches from the four schools serving the residents of Montgomery Township. Each team's coaches introduced the students and described the team's project and their accomplishments. Each team received a Certificate of Recognition from the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township. Resolution #1, made by Vice Chairman Joseph Walsh, seconded by Supervisor Michael Fox, and adopted unanimously, recognized the teams and coaches from the Montgomery Elementary team (5th & 6th graders), the Pennbrook Middle



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School team (Pennbrook, Montgomery and Bridle Path Elementary schools), Mary Mother of the Redeemer School teams and the Penndale Middle school team (Penndale, Pennbrook Middle schools and North Penn High School).

Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera opened the public hearing for proposed Ordinance #12-258Z - Zoning Map Amendment - North Wales Road and proposed Ordinance #12-259Z -Text Amendment –RS Regional Shopping District Regulations at 8:28 p.m. Notes of testimony were taken by Court Reporter, Tim Kurek. Township Solicitor Frank Bartle introduced the proposed ordinances and read the legal advertisement into the record. Attorney Robert Brandt and Professional Engineer Mike Kissinger were sworn in and provided testimony regarding the proposed rezoning of the six parcels of property along North Wales Road from R-2 Residential to RS-Regional Shopping Center. Mr. Brandt testified that these six lots would be "deed restricted" in perpetuity to be used only for landscape buffer, storm water control and reserve parking purposes. Under public comment, residents Don Sherman, Adele Herman, Marilyn O'Connell and John Giardetti made comments regarding the buffering between the mall and their properties on North Wales Road, the current volume of traffic and the impact of additional traffic, storm water management controls, possible addition of a future parking area, location of loading docks, outside seating and other potential uses for properties zoned RS-Regional Shopping Center. Mr. Brandt, Mr. Kissinger, along with Township Consultants Ken Amey, Russell Dunleavy, Judith Stern Goldstein and Kevin Johnson responded to the resident's concerns. The public hearing was closed at 9:20 p.m. The Board members expressed their concern for the residents of Montgomery Village and stated that they would have only favorably considered the proposal to rezone the six properties if the deed restriction existed to protect the neighboring North Wales Road properties for the future. Resolutions #3 & #4, made by Vice Chairman Joseph Walsh, seconded by Supervisor Michael Fox, and adopted unanimously,



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approved Ordinance #12-258Z – Zoning Map Amendment – North Wales Road and Ordinance #12-259Z – Text Amendment – RS-Regional Shopping District Regulations.

Director of Planning Bruce Shoupe reported that the plan being presented by the Montgomery Mall was a Preliminary/Final Land Development plan for the construction of a Wegman's supermarket on the site of the former Boscov's store. Mr. Shoupe reported that the preliminary plans propose the construction of a new 144,400 square foot Wegman's Supermarket, which includes a 4,400 square foot outdoor seating area. The Township staff and consultants have reviewed this plan for compliance with Township codes. The applicant has requested 23 waivers from technical requirements of the subdivision/land development code. The staff and consultants recommend that the waivers be granted only to the extent that they concur with the recommendation of the consultants. Robert Brandt, Esquire, representing the Simon Property Group, indicated that the resolution has been reviewed and accepted by his clients. Mr. Brandt stated that this is a win-win situation for the Township as its consultants have been demanding, and the Simon Property Group believes that it has met these requirements as best as possible. Vice Chairman Joseph Walsh said that the Board is excited to see the continued economic viability of the Mall and the Board has tried to weigh that with the concerns of the residents along North Wales Road. Vice Chairman Walsh said that the Township needs to see the mall survive. Supervisor Michael Fox asked Kevin Johnson if the Township has done everything it could to study the traffic issues for a project of this type? Mr. Johnson indicated that the Township has done a significant number of studies and he is convinced that with the significant road improvements currently taking place in the area and the opening of the 202 Parkway, traffic issues along North Wales Road should improve. Supervisor Michael Fox inquired if all of the required improvement security bonds were in place? Mr. Bartle indicated that the land development agreement will call for plans and requested improvement security bonds to be filed before any permits are issued. Supervisor Michael Fox inquired if the



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waivers were in line with this type of project. Russell Dunleavy reported that some of the conditions were minor and expected in a redevelopment of this size and type. Mr. Dunleavy also reported that his main concern was with the storm water management and that the applicant has addressed this issue. Mr. Dunleavy indicated that he supports the waivers being requested. Judith Stern Goldstein reported that from a landscaping perspective, there is a substantial amount of landscaping proposed on the site and there are still an additional 250 trees and 135 shrubs that they are asking for a waiver of. Those will either be replaced elsewhere on the mall property or provide a fee in lieu of. Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera suggested that the mall could use more plantings around the property. Planning Consultant Ken Amey stated that the plan has been through several revisions and it is now a well thought out plan. Mr. Amey's main concern was finally resolving the North Wales Road parcels and knowing that there will always been a 100 foot buffer along the road. Kevin Johnson added that if there had been any other type of development on those six properties, the Township may not have been able to require any on and off site traffic improvements as are being performed under this project. Resolution #5, made by Supervisor Michael Fox, seconded by Vice Chairman Walsh, and adopted unanimously, approved the preliminary/final land development plan for Montgomery Mall Expansion/Wegman's Supermarket.

Director of Administration and Human Resources Ann Shade reported on the list of Fall 2012 Recreation Programs to be offered to the public during the months of September to December 2012. The Fall 2012 Recreation offerings included many popular programs with some new programs being introduced as well. Resolution #6, made by Chairman Candyce Fluehr Chimera, seconded by Supervisor Robert Birch, and adopted unanimously, approved the 2012 Fall Recreation Programs and Fees.



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Vice Chairman Joseph Walsh made a motion to approve the payment of bills.

Supervisor Jeffrey McDonnell seconded the motion. The payment of bills was unanimously approved as submitted.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 9:40 p.m.

BACKGROUND:

Mr. Franklin Ha, a resident of Montgomery Township, recently joined the Fire Department of Montgomery Township. Mr. Ha is being nominated by FDMT to be appointed as a Special Fire Police Officer under the Pennsylvania State Fire Police Statute - Act of 1941, P.L. 137, No. 74, Amended July 11,1980. P.L. 580. No.122.

Under this law, before the applicant can perform the duties as a Special Fire Police Officer, the nominated candidate must be confirmed by the Board of Supervisors and sworn in by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors. Special Fire Police serve the public in the following manner:

- To regulate traffic and keep crowds under control at or in the vicinity of any fire at which their companies are in attendance and to exercise such other police powers as are necessary in order to facilitate and prevent interference with the work of firemen in extinguishing fires.
- To perform their duties when functioning as special fire police at any function, event, or parade conducted by, and under the auspices of any volunteer fire company, or any event, function, or parade conducted by an organization other than a volunteer fire company, providing the request to perform these duties is made by the governing body of the township in which the event will be conducted.
- To perform traffic and or crowd control duties when accidents, floods, or any other emergency requiring performance of such duties until the arrival of proper township police authority or until the emergency no longer exists.

Any person functioning as Special Fire Police Officer and performing a duty under any of the above conditions, shall be deemed to be performing the duties of his/her employment. Fire police performing such duties shall be identifiable by, at minimum, the wearing of a distinctive arm band or hat or uniform or insignia. Under no circumstances does the act grant Special Fire Police the right and / or power to use firearms or other weapons in the exercise of special fire police powers granted under the law.

BACKGROUND:

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced that the FY2012 application period for the Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG) opened on June 11, 2012. Federal funding for the FY 2012 AFG Grant Program is \$285 million. The goal of the AFG grant is to enhance, through financial assistance, the safety of the public and firefighters from fire and fire-related hazards.

Specifically, the program provides grant funding to assist local fire departments in the following five areas:

- Firefighter Training
- Firefighter Equipment
- Firefighter Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Firefighter Wellness and Fitness
- Modifications to Fire Stations and Facilities

Under this grant program, fire companies can either apply as an individual organization or as a group of fire companies in a joint application as a "regional project". A regional project is one in which multiple organizations serving more than one local jurisdiction benefit directly from the activities implemented with the grant funds. Regional projects are designed to facilitate interoperability and efficiency among the participating jurisdictions.

After speaking with several local fire companies, there is a need among three fire departments, Centre Square. North Penn and the Montgomery Township of Fire Services/Fire Department of Montgomery Township, to replace aging self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). The joint application replacement of SCBA equipment complies with the requirements of the grant program and is more likely to be favorably considered for award as this equipment will facilitate interoperability and efficiency among the three participating mutual aid fire departments.

According to the grant program, DHS considers a SCBA unit to be obsolete if it is older than two NFPA Standards cycle changes or 10 years of age, whichever is less. After evaluating our existing SCBA equipment, it was determined that twenty (20) of our thirty-six (36) SCBA units are considered by DHS to be obsolete.

The new SCBA equipment will have an "automatic-on" integrated Personal Alert Safety System (PASS) device, and be Chemical Biological Radiological Nuclear and Explosive Equipment (CBRNE) compliant with the current edition of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1981 Standard governing Open Circuit Self Contained Breathing Apparatus for Fire Protection Services.

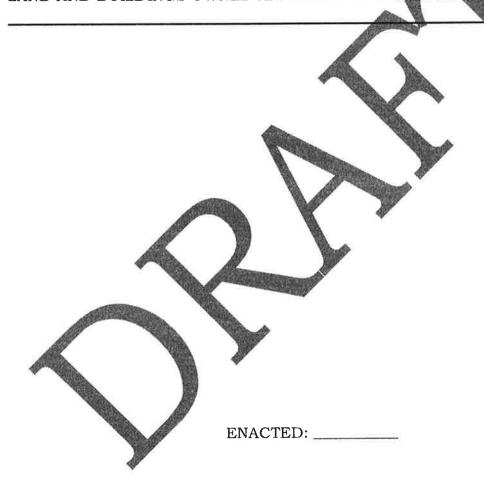

SECTION 1. Amendment to Article III, Section 230-9 [Uses By Township].

Article III, Section 230-9 [Uses By Township] shall be amended to provide that the provisions of the Township's zoning Ordinance do not apply to land and buildings owned and used for Township governmental functions:

§ 230-9. Uses by Township.

The provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to land and buildings owned for the performance of the governmental functions of the Township of Montgomery.

SECTION 2. Repeal and Ratification.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith or in conflict with any of the specific terms enacted hereby, to the extent of said inconsistencies or conflicts, are hereby specifically repealed. Any other terms and provisions of the ordinances of the Township that are unaffected by this Ordinance are hereby reaffirmed and ratified.

SECTION 3. Severability.

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase in this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and affect, and for this reason the provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable.

SECTION 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after enactment.

BACKGROUND:

As part of the Township's approval of The Cutler Group, Inc.'s "Enclave at Montgomery" development, the Township obtained a 20-acre tract of land for recreation use, named Friendship Park. Under the various approvals granted for the development, the developer was required to make a cash contribution totaling @ \$1.3M towards development of the park improvements.

In lieu of taking the cash contribution, the Township opted to credit the developer with the value of the contributions in exchange for the developer paying for the cost of engineering/design and construction of the park improvements up to the total value of the required contribution. Further, the developer was obligated to start construction of the improvements following either the issuance of the first residential permit in excess of 50% of all units permitted within the overall development. The trigger for start of the park improvements has now been met.

At this time, the engineering for site work, including the grading, storm water management and parking lot/pathway paving work is completed and the PADEP Earth Disturbance permit has been issued. The developer has provided three quotes from contractors to perform the initial site work. The quotes have been reviewed by the Township Engineer (copy of report attached) and they are recommending that the developer select Wolverine Constructor Company to perform this work.

In addition, John Antonucci, President of Chrystal Green Distributors, has asked the Township to consider the installation of the "Pave Drain" paver block system for the surface of the new parking lot in lieu of asphalt paving to serve as a demonstration project of the systems potential storm water management benefits. His proposal is pending review. Since the developer will be responsible for the construction of the improvements at the park, including the parking lot, any decision regarding the use of the Pave Drain System would need to be coordinated with the developer.

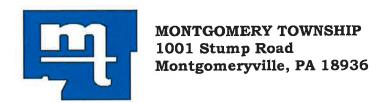

DISPOSAL POLICY FOR PERSONAL PROPERTY OF TOWNSHIP

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to provide a procedure for disposing the Township's personal property that is not needed, in poor condition, or obsolete. This policy is in accord with Second Class Township Code, as amended.¹

SCOPE:

This policy specifically covers any personal property, either individual items or lots of items, the fair market value of which is estimated to be less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000). It is applicable to all Township departments including: Administration; Fire Services; Finance; Planning; Police; and Public Works.

Sale of personal property of the Township with an estimated fair market value of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, requires approval from the Board of Supervisors, and shall not be sold except to the highest bidder after due notice in accord with the Second Class Township Code.²

When in doubt it is best to discuss the proposed property disposal or transfer with the Township's Finance Director or designee.

DISPOSAL PROCESS:

The Finance Department shall be responsible to keep an equipment schedule for all personal property of the Township. It assigns an asset number to all such property. The disposal process depends on the estimated fair market value of the personal property.

As such there are two disposal processes: one for property estimated to be less than \$1000; and another for property estimated to be \$1000 or more:

A. Disposal process for property estimated to be less than \$1000:

Any department proposing to dispose personal property of the Township with estimated fair market value to be less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) must follow the following procedure:

- 1. The disposal of any personal property of the Township must be recorded on an Inventory form. The transfer of any personal property from one Township department to another also must be recorded on the Inventory form.³
- 2. The Department Head or designee will notify the Finance Director regarding the disposal of the personal property, its associated inventory number (if applicable), and a statement of the property's condition.
- 3. The Finance Director or designee will send the Inventory Form with the property information to all Township Department Heads to see if other Departments are interested in the property.
- 4. If no Township Departments are interested in the property, then the Finance Director or designee will notify the Township Manager to request disposal of the property.
- 5. If the property is in good condition, it may be donated to a non-profit organization (*i.e.*, schools, charities, etc.). If the property is in poor condition and is no longer able to be utilized, it may be disposed of or (if recycled (if applicable). Any monies received for recycling is the property of the Township and should be forwarded to the Finance Director for appropriate handling.

6. Once approved, the Finance Director or designee will take the final step to dispose of the property.

B. Disposal process for property estimated to be \$1000 or more:

Any department proposing to dispose any personal property of the Township with an estimated fair market value to be one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more must follow the following procedure:

- 1. The disposal of any personal property of the Township must be recorded on an Inventory form. The transfer of any personal property from one Township department to another also must be recorded on the Inventory form.⁴
- 2. The Department Head or designee will notify the Finance Director regarding the disposal of the personal property, its associated inventory number (if applicable), and a statement of the property's condition.
- 3. The Finance Director will notify the Township Manager. The Township Manager will place the item on the Board of Supervisors' Agenda for consideration to place such property out to public bidding or auction in accord with the Second Class Township Code, as amended.⁵
- 4. Once approval is received from the Board, the property is able to go to public bidding or auction through an authorized company in accord with the Second Class Township Code, as amended.⁶

The bidding and advertising requirements mentioned above, and more fully set forth in Appendix 1 do not apply to the following transactions:

- 1. If personal property of the township is being traded in or exchanged for other personal property.
 - 2. The sale or lease of personal property to any municipal corporation, the Federal Government, the Commonwealth or any institution district, school district, municipality authority, county, public utility, volunteer fire company, nonprofit corporation engaged in community industrial development, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue squad located within the township, nonprofit corporation organized as a public library, nonprofit medical service corporation, nonprofit housing

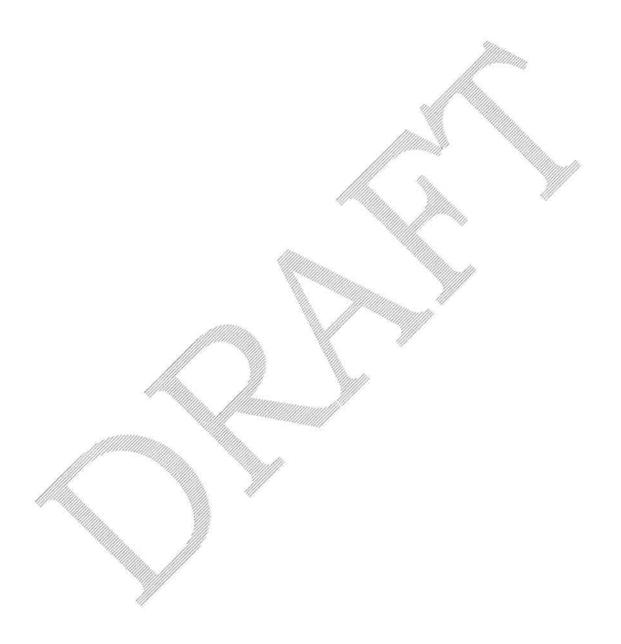

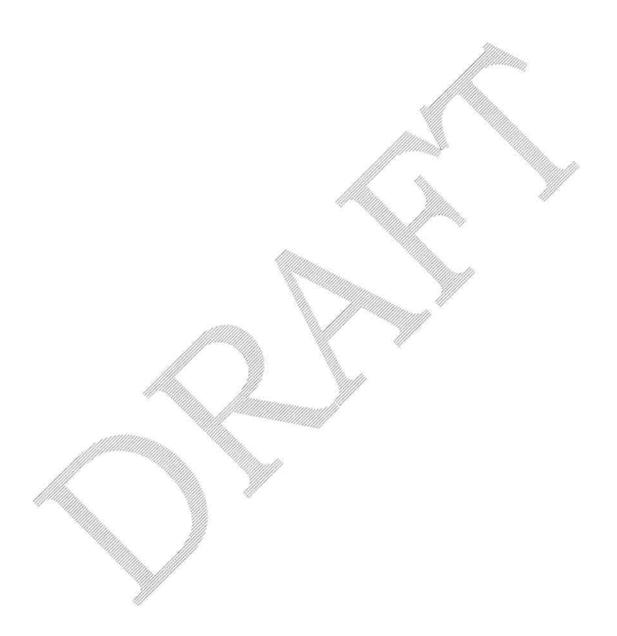
Section 1504 of the Second Class Township Code

SECOND CLASS TOWNSHIP CODE

- §1504. Personal Property. -(a) No personal property of the township shall be sold or disposed of without the approval of the board of supervisors. No personal property owned by the township, the estimated fair market value of which is one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, shall be sold except to the highest bidder after due notice by advertisement for bids or for public auction in one newspaper of general circulation in the township. The advertisement shall be published once not less than ten days before the date set for the opening of bids or public auction, and the date for opening bids or public auction shall be announced in the advertisement. The advertisement for electronic auction sales authorized in subsection (d) shall include the Internet address or means of accessing the electronic auction and the date, time and duration of the electronic auction. If after attempting twice to receive bids or if at a public auction no bid was received, the board of supervisors may by resolution adopt a procedure by which the personal property may be sold without further action of the board of supervisors. A procedure adopted pursuant to this authorization shall be subject to and shall conform with the requirements of any law governing the sale of property by municipal corporations generally when no bids have been received. The awarded of contracts shall be made only by public announcement at a regular or special meeting of the board of supervisors or at the public auction. Except as provided in subsection (d), all bids shall be accepted on the condition that payment of the purchase price in full is made immediately upon acceptance of the successful bid. The board of supervisors may reject any bids received if the bids are believed to be less than the fair market value of the property.
- (b) With respect to personal property, either individual items or lots of items, the fair market value of which is estimated to be less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), the board of supervisors shall by resolution adopt a procedure by which the property may be sold without further action by the board of supervisors. The board of supervisors may arrange for the sale of the item or items at public auction.
- (c) The bidding and advertising requirements of this section do not apply to the following transactions: (1) If personal property of the township is being traded in or exchanged for other personal property. (2) The sale or lease of personal property to any municipal corporation, the Federal Government, the Commonwealth or any institution district, school district, municipality authority, county, public utility, volunteer fire company, nonprofit corporation engaged in community industrial development, volunteer ambulance service or volunteer rescue squad located within the township, nonprofit corporation organized as a public library, nonprofit medical service corporation, nonprofit housing corporation, nonprofit organizations providing community service or development activities or nonprofit corporation established for the preservation of historical, architectural or aesthetical sites or artifacts.
- (d) A "public auction" shall include an online or electronic auction sale. During an electronic auction sale, bids shall be accepted electronically at the time and in the manner designated in the advertisement. During the electronic auction, each bidder shall have the capability to view the bidder's bid rank or the high bid price. Bidders may increase their bid prices during the electronic auction. The record of the electronic auction shall be accessible for public inspection. The purchase price shall

be paid by the high bidder immediately or at a reasonable time after the conclusion of the electronic auction as determined by the township. In the event that shipping costs are incurred, they shall be paid by the high bidder. (e) A township that has complied with the advertising requirements of subsection (a) may provide additional public notice of the sale by bids or public auction in any manner deemed appropriate by the township. (1504 amended by Act 49 of 2006)
