MINUTES OF MEETING MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS APRIL 28, 2014

Vice Chairman Michael Fox called the executive session to order at 7:30 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Robert Birch and Jeffrey McDonnell. Chairman Joseph Walsh was absent. Also in attendance were Robert Iannozzi, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan and Bruce Shoupe.

Vice Chairman Michael Fox called the action meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Robert Birch and Jeffrey McDonnell. Chairman Joseph Walsh was absent. Also in attendance were Robert Iannozzi, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Chief J. Scott Bendig, Richard Lesniak, Ann Shade, Stacy Crandell, Kevin Costello, Bruce Shoupe, Richard Grier and Deb Rivas.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Vice Chairman Michael Fox called for public comment from the audience and there was none.

Township Solicitor Robert lannozzi, Esquire reported that the Board had met in an executive session earlier in the evening at 7:30 p.m. Mr. lannozzi reported that the Board discussed a matter potential litigation and a litigation matter regarding the Lesinski EEOC complaint. Mr. lannozzi also reported that these matters are legitimate subjects of executive session pursuant to Pennsylvania's Sunshine Law.

Vice Chairman Michael Fox made a motion and Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the April 14, 2014 Board meeting. The minutes of the meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Vice Chairman Michael Fox opened a public hearing on the Conditional Use Application, #C-62, for Integral Development Associates for 976 Bethlehem Pike. Notes of testimony were taken by Court Reporter, Tim Kurek. Township Solicitor Robert lannozzi introduced the conditional use application, read the legal advertisement and listed the exhibits on the record. Mitchell Russell, Esquire, Integral Development Associates Managing Partner and legal

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representative for the applicant, introduced representatives from The Tile Shop organization, Carl Randazzo and Dan Granados, their attorney, Joseph Gamble, Esquire, as well as Integral Development Associates managing partner, Eugene Mayer. Integral Development Associates proposes to lease the former Lane Furniture store space with The Tile Shop. Mr. Russell reported that the proposal does not require any changes to the exterior of the building other than new building signage. The proposed use is a specialty retailer of natural stone, ceramic, porcelain and glass materials for interior and exterior floor and wall applications in patio, kitchens and bathroom renovations. The applicant represented that they meet the conditional use requirements of the Montgomery Township Zoning Code for approval as a specialty retail store which is authorized in the HLI-II District by Conditional Use. The hearing was closed at 8:19 p.m. Resolution #1, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Robert Birch and adopted unanimously, approved the Conditional Use, #C-62, for Integral Development Associates for 976 Bethlehem Pike.

Assistant to the Township Manager Stacy Crandell announced that in honor of Montgomery Township's 300th Anniversary Celebration, the Township is organizing a 5k Run on May 17, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. at the William F. Maule Park at Windlestrae. The proceeds of this run will be donated to the Wounded Warrior Project. The Township is appreciative of the many local businesses that have sponsored the run. The Board encouraged residents to sign up for the run and support a great cause. Presently, there are 96 runners signed up for the event.

Township Manager Lawrence J. Gregan presented the 1st Quarter 2014 Budget report. Mr. Gregan's presentation summarized the year-to-date operating results through March 31, 2014 and identified the significant activities in the fund balance, revenues and expenses. Mr. Gregan reported that overall the Township finances continue to be in excellent condition. The budgeted revenues are 5% below the prior year, which is expected, and the expenses have increased due to the significant weather events of the past three months. The Township is still

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anticipating a conservative surplus at the end of this year despite increased expenses due to the weather events.

Township Manager Lawrence Gregan proposed amendments to the 2014 Budget to account for the following unbudgeted projects, grants and activities that occurred during the first quarter of 2014. Installation of Traffic Signal Improvements at North Wales and Knapp Roads and a replacement vehicle for the Police Department. During the 1st Quarter of 2014, the Board of Supervisors authorized the purchase of equipment necessary for the traffic signal improvements at the intersection of North Wales and Knapp Roads. Funding for this project was received from Simon Properties as a contribution towards offsite traffic improvements related to the Wegmans' land development. A police vehicle was struck by another vehicle while en route to a call. The vehicle was deemed a total loss by the Township's insurance carrier. The Board authorized the replacement of this vehicle in February 2014. Resolution #2, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, approved the 2014 1st Quarter Budget Amendments.

Resolution #3, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, approved the escrow release #1 for LD/S #664OHB for Maple Brook Estates in the amount of \$334,046.02.

Vice Chairman Michael Fox made a motion to approve the payment of bills. Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera seconded the motion. The payment of bills was unanimously approved as submitted.

Under other business, Township Manager Lawrence Gregan reported that as a condition of approval of the Highway Occupancy Permit for BJ's Land Development Plan, the applicant is required to perform traffic signal improvements at the intersection of Cowpath Road/Five Points Points Plaza Driveway and Cowpath Road/Taylor Road. The improvements will include the installation of "adaptive signal controls", installation of new pedestrian signal head and

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installation of ADA push buttons. Resolution #4, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, authorized the submission of the traffic signal upgrades applications.

BACKGROUND:

In July of 2001, The Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association introduced the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Program. This Program was designed and developed to provide a strategy for the continued professionalization of law enforcement agencies within our Commonwealth. The accreditation process involves the development and incorporation of best police practices and procedures in over three hundred identifiable benchmarks targeted to improve department performance.

In 2004, the Montgomery Township Police Department became the eighteenth police department in Pennsylvania to be accredited under the Accreditation Program. Since achieving accreditation in 2004, the Police Department has undergone reaccreditation in 2007, and again in 2011. On January 13 and January 14, 2014, assessors from the Accreditation Program performed an on-site reaccreditation assessment of the Police Department. On April 2, 2014, The Montgomery Township Police Department was reaccredited by the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission.

This evening, Abington Township Police Chief William J. Kelly is here to present the Certificate of Law Enforcement Accreditation to the Township. Chief Kelly serves as the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission Chairman as well as 1st Vice President of the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association.

BACKGROUND:

In honor of Police Week, the Police Department would like to recognize several members of the Department for their outstanding performance in the line of duty during the second-half of the 2013 calendar year as recommended by the Police Department's Award Committee:

Letter of Official Commendation-Officer Todd Walter:

In early 2013, Officer Todd Walter initiated an investigation into prescription frauds occurring in Montgomery Township and surrounding communities. After extensive investigation, Officer Walter was able to identify two suspects using the identity of others to fraudulently fill prescriptions for Schedule II controlled substances. These subjects were subsequently arrested and charged with obtaining and passing approximately 190 fraudulent prescriptions for controlled substances throughout Bucks and Montgomery Counties.

Official Commendation for Merit - Officer John Rushin:

On August 31, 2014, at 8:14 PM, Officer John Rushin observed a service van in the rear of Water Tower Square. A ladder was extended to the rear of the building. Officer Rushin located an air conditioner repairman who produced a work order for the building. Officer Rushin, aware of recent thefts from rooftops, noted the repairman's nervous demeanor. Officer Rushin investigated further, and subsequently learned that the repairman was stripping copper from commercial air conditioning units. The repairman subsequently admitted to additional thefts in Montgomery Township and New Jersey totaling over \$20,000.00. The repairman is also a suspect in several similar thefts in Montgomery County.

Letter of Official Commendation - Officer Thomas Ward and Officer Michael Jenkins:

On October 9, 2013, at 12:30 AM, Officer Thomas Ward conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle on Route 309 for a vehicle code violation. Officer Ward noted several factors during his investigation that led him to believe that drugs were in the vehicle. Officer Michael Jenkins, assisting Officer Ward, observed a small bundle of heroin on the rear floor of the vehicle. The vehicle was impounded and a search warrant for the vehicle was obtained. A search of the vehicle revealed a secret compartment containing over 8,000 bags of heroin worth an estimated \$80,000.00.

Official Commendation for Life Saving - Officer Jeffrey DePolo and Officer Jake Beebe:

On October 30, 2014, at 4:50 PM, Officer Jeffrey DePolo and Officer Jake Beebe responded to the 200 block of Hopkins Court in Montgomery Township for a medical emergency. Upon arrival, officers encountered a patient who, after choking on food, had become unresponsive. The patient was ashen and no pulse was detected. Officer immediately began CPR and attempted to remove the obstruction. As CPR continued the obstruction was moved and the patient began to breathe on her own.

<u>United States Police Canine Association - Third Quarter Detector Award Officer Daniel Rose/K9 Duke and Officer Brian Schreiber/K9 Bauer:</u>

On September 26, 2013, at 7:00 AM, Officer Daniel Rose/K9 Duke and Officer Brian Schreiber/K9 Bauer were requested to assist law enforcement authorities in the apprehension of a subject wanted for an attempted murder that occurred in North Jersey. The subject was believed to be residing in Lower Gwynedd Township. During the course of the arrest both canine teams were asked to search vehicles owned by the subject. Both canines alerted to the presence of drugs. Search warrants were approved for the vehicles and home of the subject resulting in the recovery of \$2,000,000 in heroin, over \$17,000 in currency, and three vehicles.

Official Commendation for Merit (from Lansdale Borough Police Department) Officer Daniel Rose/K9 Duke:

On January 13, 2014, at 4:44 PM, Officer Daniel Rose and K9 Duke responded to the Lansdale Borough to assist their Police Department to help locate a subject wanted for an attempted abduction in a park. The canine team conducted a track from the park narrowed the direction of the actor resulting in the establishing of a perimeter and subsequent apprehension of the subject.

From November 4, 2013 to December 6, 2013, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) accepted applications to the FY2013 Assistance to Firefighters Grant program. The goal of the grant program is to enhance, through financial assistance, the safety of the public and firefighters regarding fire and fire-related hazards.

Specifically, the program provides funding to assist local fire departments in the following three areas:

- Operations and Safety
- Vehicle Acquisition
- Joint/Regional Applications

The FDMT submitted an application to purchase forty-four (44) self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA); one for every riding position on our apparatus.

BACKGROUND:

In 1999, Pennsylvania adopted legislation that enacted the Uniform Construction Code (UCC). One aspect of the UCC is the requirement for inspectors to receive and maintain certification based on the type of work performed. Inspectors are required to complete 15 credit hours of continuing education credits in courses relating to the professional competency of code administration. An applicant with multiple certification areas must complete a minimum of 15 credit hours of continuing education credits for each certification but not more than 45 credit hours during each three year certification cycle.

Continuing education credit hours are offered through a variety of means including the attendance at meetings and courses. Most commonly, inspectors attend courses presented by the Pennsylvania Construction Codes Academy. The courses, ranging from one to five days, are held across the state and cost between \$25.00 and \$325.00.

Firefighter Robert Hedden currently holds three certifications in the State of Pennsylvania and has recently submitted an application for renewal of those certifications for a new three year cycle (2013 -2016). He is requesting approval to take a course titled "Right of Entry" and "Fire Sprinkler Protection in Storage Applications" courses to satisfy 16 of his required 45 Continuing Education credits. These courses are being offered on June 3, 2014 and June 5, 2014, respectively, through the New Jersey Center for Services at The Inn at Lambertville Station, Lambertville, NJ. Courses offered through the Center for Government Services are offered free of charge.

BACKGROUND:

At the April 14, 2014 Board of Supervisors Meeting, the Board authorized the advertisement of a proposed ordinance that would adopt Stormwater Management regulations for the Township in compliance with the requirements of the Neshaminy Creek Watershed Act 167 Stormwater Management Plan.

This ordinance is required to be adopted by all municipalities in the Neshaminy Creek watershed within 6 months of the approval of the Plan by the Montgomery County Commissioners, the Bucks County Commissioners and the PA Department of Environmental Protection which approval was given in November 22, 2013.

While the Township currently has stormwater management regulations in effect in its Subdivision/Land Development Code, these new regulations will provide for a standardized set of regulations for stormwater management controls for a wider range of activities. Further, this ordinance anticipates the approval of a Wissahickon Creek Act 167 Stormwater Management Plan in the near future and therefore proactively proposes the application of the new stormwater management regulations equally across the entire Township.

We have prepared the attached power point presentation to summarize the major provisions of the new stormwater regulations.

ZONING, SUBDIVISION OR LAND DEVELOPMENT IMPACT:

The new Stormwater Ordinance Regulations will be applicable to activities identified in Section 206-5 of the ordinance.

Montgomery Township Stormwater Management Ordinance

The Public Works Department is proposing the demolition of the structures on Township owned property at 1237 Stump Road. This property was purchased by the Township in December 2011 to provide for a future trail connection between the Township's Zehr Park and the 202 Parkway Trail.

Proposals were obtained from three (3) demolition contractors to perform this work with the lowest responsible proposal received from Kneckel Demolition and Excavating of Harleysville, PA in the amount of \$16,900.

This cost proposal excludes certification and capping of the on-site water well which must be removed and certified by Miller Pump. The other bids received were from Geppert Bros, Inc. in the amount of \$18,630 and from Walter J. Boileau & Co., Inc. in the amount of \$19,900.

Funding for the demolition work was not included in the 2014 Budget however due to the deterioration of the structure over the past winter we recommend that the structure be demolished and the well tested/capped this year.




