Regular Meeting

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 pm.

Approval of Minutes – March 21, 2023

• On a motion by Mr. Rex and a second by Mr. Katz, the minutes from the March 21, 2023 EAC meeting were approved.

New Business

- Review existing single-use plastic ban ordinances and develop a list of recommendations: The EAC researched existing single-use plastic ban ordinances in PA municipalities and developed a list of recommendations, which are attached to these minutes. Mr. Rex will share these recommendations with the Board of Supervisors during the May 8, 2023 Board of Supervisors meeting.
- **EcoNews Review** Mr. Muller stated he will send a draft of the EcoNews when it is available.
- Hatfield Plant Exchange idea to consider: Ms. Staab shared information about Hatfield's Plant Exchange, and suggested Montgomery Township offer a similar program in conjunction with the existing Roy Rodriguez Arbor Day Tree Giveaway, which is coordinated by the Shade Tree Commission.

- Call it "Plastic Waste Reduction" Ordinance
- Items to include: Plastic bags, plastic straws, expanded polystyrene foam (i.e. Styrofoam)
 - Encourage plastic utensils to be given only upon request, but don't ban them
 - Leave the conversation open to incorporate plastic utensils and plastic takeout containers in the future.
- Charge for paper bags if customer does not bring a bag: 15 cents per bag
 - Paper bags offered must be a minimum of 40% recycled paper
- Violations: Fees as described in the draft ordinance:
 - Warning
 - 1st offense after warning: \$50
 - o 2nd offense: \$100
 - 3rd and further offenses: \$200
- **Enforcement:** A complaint form may be created for citizens to report. The Township will deploy resources to investigate as appropriate.
- Grace period to use remaining supply: 6 months
- Communication:
 - Signage will be drafted that businesses will be required to post leading up to the ban
 - Education about alternative materials
 - Notice about Ordinance to businesses: Online social media, newsletter channels and direct mailing to businesses
