

**MINUTES OF MEETING
MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MAY 9, 2011**

Chairman Robert Birch called to order the executive session at 6:30 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Lawrence Gregan and Frank Bartle, Esquire. Matters of litigation, potential litigation and matters of personnel were discussed.

Chairman Robert Birch called the regular action meeting to order at 8:05 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Frank Bartle, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Richard Brady, William Brightcliffe, Bruce Shoupe, Kevin Costello, Ann Shade, Shannon Drosnock, Stacy Crandell and Shirley Snyder.

Chairman Robert Birch called for public comment from the audience and there was none.

Frank Bartle, Esquire, announced that the Board met in executive session at 6:30 p.m. There were five matters of personnel discussed, two involving police personnel issues, two involving policies affecting certain employees and one involving appointments to boards and commissions. There were also three matters of litigation or potential litigation matters discussed: The Zehr condemnation matter, a business tax appeal, and a potential matter of litigation regarding a former employee. Mr. Bartle said that these matters are legitimate subjects for an executive session pursuant to Pennsylvania Sunshine law.

Chairman Robert Birch made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 25, 2011 Board meeting and Supervisor Candyce Chimera seconded the motion. The minutes of meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Ann Shade, Director of Administration & Human Resources introduced Sharon Tucker as the new Recreation Coordinator, effective May 9, 2011. In this position, Ms. Tucker will be responsible for developing, promoting, coordinating and administering the Township's recreation

programs. Resolution #1 unanimously recognized and welcomed Sharon Tucker as the Recreation Coordinator with Montgomery Township, effective May 9, 2011.

Resolution #2 unanimously acknowledged the voluntary resignation of Leah Kim and recognized her for her commitment to public service during her employment at Montgomery Township.

Chief Richard Brady announced that National Law Enforcement Week will be celebrated the week of May 15, 2011. The Montgomery Township Police Department will be hosting a special celebration on Saturday, May 14th at Montgomery Mall from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Resolution #3 unanimously recognized National Law Enforcement Week, May 15th through May 21st, 2011, with a special celebration to be held at Montgomery Mall on Saturday, May 14th.

Kevin Costello reported that National Public Works Week is being celebrated this year the week of May 15th through May 21st. The theme for this year is *Public Works, Serving you and Your Community*. Resolution #4 unanimously recognized the week of May 15th through May 21, 2011 as National Public Works Week and extended appreciation to the men and women of the Montgomery Township Public Works Department for their efforts on behalf of the residents of and visitors to Montgomery Township. The Board approved a pizza lunch for the Public Works crew for all their efforts on behalf of the Township.

Bruce Shoupe reported that the Township currently owns and maintains 61 stormwater management basins. In 2010, six of these basins were allowed to be naturalized and this year the Shade Tree Commission is recommending that seven additional basins be naturalized. Naturalizing stormwater basins involves transforming a conventional basin into a natural ecosystem capable of providing habitat, water quality treatment and aesthetic value, and create "no mow" areas in these basins to promote natural growth. Supervisor Joseph Walsh noted that the Environmental Advisory Committee is very much in support of this effort. Resolution #5

unanimously approved the additional seven basins to promote natural growth, that a letter be sent to the residents near the basins identified, and a sign be posted at each basin.

Lawrence Gregan reported that per the Township Code, streetlights may be installed along each street in the Township by a developer at the expense of the developer, unless waived by the Board of Supervisors. A plan for the installation of the lights must be submitted as part of the development application and the streetlights are required to be constructed in accordance with Township street lighting specifications. These specifications were last updated and approved in 2003 and due to changes in materials, technology, and electrical standards have been reviewed and updated by the Township's Traffic Engineer. Resolution #6 unanimously approved the adoption of updated Street Lighting Specifications for the Township, as prepared by Traffic Planning and Design, Inc., dated September 2010.

William Brightcliffe reported that the Fire Services Department is proposing to submit an application under the 2011/2012 Act 147 Grant Program in the amount of \$4,011.45, for the purchase of a base radio for the Emergency Operations Center. This grant, if approved, would be used to help enhance the Townships Emergency Operations Preparedness through training, planning and equipment for the Township Emergency Operations Center. Resolution #7 unanimously approved the submission of an application to the Act 147 Radiological Emergency Response Program in the amount of \$4,011.45.

Shannon Drosnock reported that the Township utilizes the NetTeller online banking system through Univest to manage the Township's banking accounts. Univest has provided the Township with an updated agreement for this service. The only change noted in the new agreement would involve adding clarity and detail to the "hold harmless" language. Resolution #8 authorized the execution of the Anytime Online Banking (NetTeller) Cash Management Agreement with Univest National Bank and Trust Company, with a vote of 4 - 0. Supervisor Michael Fox recused himself, as an employee of Univest National Bank and Trust Company.

Lawrence Gregan reported that according to the Second Class Township Code, personal property owned by the Township, with an estimated fair market value of \$1,000 or more, may only be sold by public bid or auction to the highest bidder after notice by advertisement. At this time the Township has six vehicles declared as surplus that it proposes be sold at public auction. Resolution #9 unanimously authorized the sale of 2001 Dodge Intrepid; 2006 Ford Crown Victoria; 2003 Ford Crown Victoria; 2006 Ford Expedition; 2007 Ford Crown Victoria at auction through J.J. Kane Auctioneers, Conshohocken, Pennsylvania.

Bruce Shoupe reported that a conditional use application has been received from T-Mobile Northeast, LLC, proposing the construction of a 10 foot extension to an existing PECO transmission tower located at 1 Goodwin Lane, and the placement of 9 T-Mobile wireless communication antennae on that extension. This submission of the application requires that the Township schedule a public hearing within 60 days. Resolution #10 unanimously approved the advertisement of the public hearing and set Monday, June 13, 2011 after 8:00 p.m. in the Township Building as the date and time for the hearing on the T-Mobile Northeast, LLC Conditional Use Application to be held.

Chairman Birch made a motion to approve the payment of bills. Supervisor Joseph Walsh seconded the motion. The payment of bills was unanimously approved as submitted.

Under other Business, Chairman Birch made a motion that the Township hire the firm of Eckert Seamans as the Labor Counsel for the Township, replacing the firm of Reed Smith, effective immediately. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Joseph Walsh, and unanimously approved.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

BACKGROUND:

The Second Class Township Code requires that annual purchases of like goods \$10,000 or more require formal bidding in accordance with the procedures in the Second Class Township Code including approval by the Board of Supervisors at a public meeting. (In addition, the Township has established a policy requiring Board of Supervisor approval for purchase of any unbudgeted items over \$1,000.) Purchases from the Pennsylvania State Cooperative Purchasing Co-Stars Program or other approved Cooperative Purchase Programs such as the Montgomery County Consortium of Communities, City of Harrisburg and Dauphin County may be substituted for formal bidding subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors.

The Public Works Department is proposing the purchase of the following equipment as provided in the 2011 Approved Final Budget:

- Purchase of a 2012 Elgin Whirlwind MV-Dual Pure Vacuum Street Sweeper Body to be used by the Public Works Department to perform various tasks such as sweeping, inlet cleaning and drainage maintenance throughout the Township. The equipment will replace an existing 1997 Elgin Geo Vac which is scheduled for replacement in 2011. Attached is a quote dated April 26, 2011 from Gran Turk Equipment Co. Inc., authorized vendor under the Co-Stars Cooperative Purchase Program Contract #025-046, to provide the requested equipment at a cost of \$151,663.00. The price quote per the cooperative purchase contract is approximately 5% off the dealer list price of \$157,835.00 and represents a savings of \$7,892.00. The equipment meets the specifications prepared by the Public Works Department.
- Purchase of a 2012 International Truck Cab and Chassis for which the street sweeper body will be mounted to. Attached is a quote dated April 19, 2011 from G L Sayre Inc., authorized vendor under Co-Stars Cooperative Purchase Program Contract #025-017 to provide the requested equipment at a cost of \$83,935.03. The price quote per the cooperative purchase contract is approximately 20% off the dealer list price of \$105,617.00 and represents a savings of \$21,681.97. The equipment meets the specifications prepared by the Public Works Department.

ALTERNATIVES/OPTIONS:

Cooperative purchasing programs use the purchasing power of local entities, to obtain more competitive pricing and choice than individual municipalities might be able to obtain on their own. The Township also saves on the expense of preparation of bid specifications, notice and advertising.

BUDGET IMPACT:

A total of \$250,000.00 was included in the 2011 Approved Final Budget Fund 01 Public Works General (Capital Replacement) for the purchase of a replacement Street Sweeper. The actual cost after discounts would be \$235,598.03.

Approve the award of the contracts for the referenced purchases per the approved 2011 Budget.

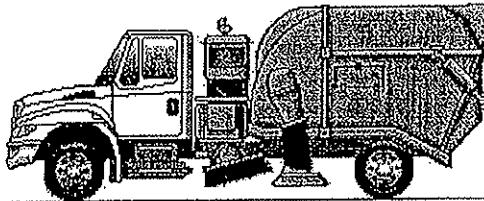





BACKGROUND:

The Public Works Department is proposing to retrofit electric lighting fixtures in the Public Works Building and portions of the Police Department in order to install more energy efficient lighting. The installation will take advantage of PECO's Smart Equipment Incentives Program to reduce the upfront cost of the equipment through rebates with further savings through a reduction in energy usage.

The attached proposals have been received from County Electric, Lansdale PA to supply new fixtures for each location as follows:

- For the Public Works Garage this would involve a capital investment of \$4,259.00. Offsetting this cost would be a one-time rebate from PECO in the amount of \$2,093.00 and an estimated annual energy saving of \$2,909.00. The projected payback from the capital investment is 8.93 months.
- For the Police Department this would involve a capital investment of \$1,283.95. Offsetting this cost would be a one-time rebate from PECO in the amount of \$750 and an estimated annual energy saving of \$1,169.70. The projected payback from the capital investment is 5.48 months.

In addition to the obvious benefit of reducing future energy costs, this effort is consistent with the recommendations of the Sustainability Audit performed by the EAC in 2009 and will result in reduction in our "carbon footprint" by reducing our energy usage from 22.19 kWh/year to 13.77 kWh/year.

The current deadline for the PECO rebates is May 31, 2011 and we will need to complete the purchase of the equipment by that time. Installation of the new fixtures will be performed by Township Public Works personnel. It should be noted that the lighting fixtures in the balance of the Township Building have all been previously retrofitted to more energy efficient lighting.

The first step would be for the Township, along with County Electric, to submit the completed PECO Application. When approved, a purchase order would be issued for the lighting equipment. Upon completion of the project PECO would inspect and approve the credit to be issued to the Township.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The total capital outlay would be \$5,542.95 less the PECO Energy Credit of \$2,843.00 would equal a net expense of \$2,699.95. Both options provide for a payback period within 6 – 9 months. Funding is available within the Building Maintenance budgets for both buildings to pay for the purchase and installation of the equipment.

BACKGROUND:

Under the Pennsylvania Workers Compensation Act, the Township is required to provide medical, rehabilitation and wage replacement benefits to employees who sustain work related injuries. The law requires the wage replacement benefits be paid at two thirds (66 2/3%) of the amount of the regular gross pay for time lost from work. These benefits take affect after seven (7) work days of absence. The wage replacement benefit paid under the Workers Compensation law is exempt from Federal and State Income Taxes.

In addition to the State's minimum requirements, the Township:

- Pays an employee's salary or wages at the rate of 100% for the first seven days of absence.
- Supplements an employee's wages so that the employee will receive 100% of their regular base pay until the 90th consecutive calendar day of absence.
- Supplements and employee's wages so that the employee will receive 75% of their salary or wages from the 91st through the 180th consecutive calendar day of absence.
- After 180 consecutive calendar day of absence the matter is reviewed for benefits under the Long Term Disability Policy which pays a 66 2/3% benefit.
- During these time period, the employee is required to submit all workers compensation check to the Township and all payments are processed through payroll.

By making supplemental payments in the amount of 100% of an employee's regular base pay and exempting the workers compensation portion from taxes, an employee on workers compensation leave could essentially receive the equivalent of 120% - 130% of their normal net pay. While we have not had an issue with employees being "encouraged" to stay out long term based on this additional net pay, it raised the question of whether or not we should consider a change in the policy to avoid such a situation in the future.

Staff recommends a change the policy to provide for the supplemental payment to be adjusted on a "tax equalized basis" so that the net base pay received by the employee during workers comp leave would be the same as their net base pay had they been working. Attached is a proposed amendment to the to the Workers Compensation provision of the Personnel Policy to affect this change for non-uniformed employees of the Township. The change would be in effect for the first 90 days of absence after which the supplemental benefit is reduced to 75%.

7. In addition to the State's minimum requirements, the Township will supplement the employee's salary or wages for approved Workers' Compensation benefits. The Township will provide a "tax equalized" supplemental injury leave pay so that the employee continues to receive his/her average weekly net base pay.

8. On the eighth (8th) day, workers' compensation benefits will begin. However, this will be supplemented by the Township so that the employee will receive a 100% "tax equalized" pay (as described above #7) until the 90th day consecutive calendar day. During this benefit period, the employee must submit all workers' compensation checks to the Finance Department.

9. If the employee's work related illness or injury causes him/her to be absent from work the 91st calendar day, the Township will continue to provide Workers' Compensation benefits. However, this will be supplemented by the Township so that the employee will receive a 75% "tax equalized" pay (as described above #7). During this benefit period, the employee must continue to submit all workers' compensation checks to the Finance Department. This will be effective from the 91st day of consecutive calendar day absence through the 180th day of continuous calendar day absence.
