MINUTES OF MEETING MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OCTOBER 11, 2011

Chairman Robert Birch called to order the executive session at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Lawrence Gregan and Frank R. Bartle, Esquire. Four matters of personnel, one matter of potential litigation and a potential purchase of real estate were discussed.

Chairman Robert Birch called the regular action meeting to order at 8:04 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox, Jeffrey McDonnell and Joseph Walsh. Also in attendance were Frank R. Bartle, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Richard Brady, Scott Bendig, Bruce Shoupe, Kevin Costello, Rick Lesniak, Ann Shade, Shannon Drosnock, Vicki Zidek and Deborah Rivas.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Robert Birch called for public comment from the audience. Richard J. Roller, 1142 Knapp Road, presented a check to the Board in the amount of \$87,803.79 for the recycling efforts of the residents of Montgomery Township in 2009. The Montgomery Township representative to the Northern Montgomery County Recycling Commission, he noted that each year, the commission provides funds based on the volume of recycling materials processed by each Township. Mr. Roller stated that the 2010 grant will be paid later this year; however, DEP has instituted a new policy to withhold 40% of the 2010 grant money to fund other DEP activities. Mr. Roller stated that this money should be coming back to the townships and for the benefit of the residents. Township Manager Lawrence Gregan reported that the Township currently utilizes the grant money to fund the activities of the Environmental Advisory Committee, a portion for recycling programs that are run by the committee. The Township does put the funds to good use.

Frank R. Bartle, Esquire, reported that the Board met in an executive session earlier in the evening at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Bartle reported that there were four matters of personnel, one

matter of potential litigation and a matter of potential purchase of real estate discussed. Mr.

Bartle reported that all of these matters are legitimate subjects of executive session pursuant to Pennsylvania's Sunshine Law.

Chairman Robert Birch made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 26, 2011 Board meeting and Supervisor Michael Fox seconded the motion. The minutes of the meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Chairman Birch announced that a new member of the Planning Commission would be appointed this evening. Steven Krumenacker is a resident of the Township and a structural engineer. Supervisor Walsh complimented Mr. Krumenacker on his impressive resume and thanked him for volunteering to become a member of the Planning Commission. Resolution #1, adopted unanimously, appointed Steven Krumenacker to the Montgomery Township Planning Commission to fill an existing term which expires in January 2013.

Finance Director, Shannon Drosnock, reported that the annual allocation by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has been received in the amount of \$414,125.20. These funds are used to support the Fire Department of Montgomery Township Relief Association for the purchase of fire equipment and training. The President of the Fire Relief Association, Dave Wolfe, was present to accept the check. Resolution #2, adopted unanimously, officially presented the check in the amount of \$414,125.50 from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the FDMT Fire Relief Association.

Fire Services Director, Rick Lesniak, reported that in 1999 Pennsylvania adopted legislation that enacted the Uniform Construction Code (UCC). Mr. Lesniak stated that one aspect of the UCC is the requirement for inspectors to receive and maintain certification based on the type of work performed and continuing education courses are required. Mr. Lesniak reported that Firefighter Robert Hedden currently holds two UCC certifications in Pennsylvania. To maintain his certifications, Firefighter Hedden is requesting permission to attend two out of



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state training sessions, one on October 12th and the other on December 8th, hosted by the New Jersey Center for Government Services. Mr. Lesniak reported that the courses offered are free of charge. Resolution #3, adopted unanimously, authorized Firefighter Hedden to attend the two training sessions.

Chairman Birch and the Board of Supervisors recognized the service provided by the Volunteers and Township Employees in the coordination of events surrounding Montgomery Township's annual Autumn Festival on October 1, 2011. Resolution #4, unanimously adopted, recognized the over 150 volunteers who contributed to the success of Autumn Festival, including Township employees, the Autumn Festival Committee, the Park and Recreation Board, the Environmental Advisory Committee, the Senior Committee, the 300th Anniversary Committee, Township Engineer Chambers Associates, Volunteer FDMT, the Key Club at North Penn High School and Central Bucks West, the North Penn High School National Honor Society, the North Penn High School Junior ROTC, the Pennbrook Middle School Volunteer Corps and the residents of Montgomery Township.

Chairman Birch reported that the Board would be considering the authorization to advertise for a public hearing on proposed Ordinance #11-251Z and proposed Ordinance #11-252Z to amend the Township Zoning Ordinance for the Billboard Overlay District Regulations and Map. Mr. Birch stated that Township Solicitor Frank Bartle had provided an overview at the last Board meeting addressing the proposed amendments and that tonight's action was to authorize the public hearing. Township Manager Lawrence Gregan reported that the proposed Ordinances would be reviewed by the appropriate Township consultants and Planning committees prior to the public hearing. Resolution #5, adopted unanimously, authorized the advertisement and set the date for the proposed Ordinances to be heard no earlier than December 12, 2011, after 8:00 p.m.

Planning Director, Bruce Shoupe, reported that the Montgomery Square United Methodist Church, LDS#638, has requested that their construction escrow be reduced to five percent (5%) of the total escrow for the 18 month maintenance period. The project is completed and all public improvements were inspected and approved. Resolution #6, adopted unanimously, authorized the release of \$66,213.60 from the escrow account for this project.

Township Manager Lawrence Gregan reported that annually the Board has adopted a resolution that establishes the minimum percentage rate that police officers are required to contribute to the Police Pension Plan for the following year. Mr. Gregan stated that the amount is based on the requirements for funding the plan and based on the funding obligations for 2012, when combined with State Aid and the Township contribution. It is proposed that Officers will continue to contribute at the rate of 5% for 2012. Resolution #7, adopted unanimously, requires the Police Officer contributions to the Police Pension Plan to continue in the amount of 5% of Base Salary, Longevity and Holiday pay for the year 2012.

Finance Director Shannon Drosnock reported that the annual general municipal pension system state aid allocation has been received for 2012. The State requires that the Board adopted a resolution approving the allocation of the State Aid to the pension systems for its employees. Ms. Drosnock stated that based on the 2011 Minimum Municipal (MMO) Obligations to the Police and Non-Uniformed Pension Plans, it has been recommended that the 2011 Pension System State Aid be allocated as follows: Police Pension Plan, 67.2% or \$410,010.94 and the Non-Uniformed Pension Plan, 32.8% or \$200,000.00, for a total of \$610,010.94. Resolution #8, adopted unanimously, accepted the recommendation for allocation as noted above.

Finance Director Shannon Drosnock reported that the accounting firm of Maillie

Falconiero has performed the Township's annual audit since 2004 and has provided the

Township with excellent service including assistance in converting the audit to the CAFR format.

Ms. Drosnock stated that Maillie Falconiero also performs the audits for the Fire Department of Montgomery Township and its Relief Association. Ms. Drosnock reported that the current engagement with Maillie Falconiero expired with the completion of the 2010 audits. Maillie Falconiero has submitted a proposal and proposed engagement letter to perform the audits for 2011 and 2012 at the same cost as the 2010 audit. Resolution #9, adopted unanimously, accepted the proposals from Maillie Falconiero to perform the 2011 and 2012 at the cost of \$28,000 for the Township Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, \$2,700 for the Fire Department of Montgomery Township Audited Financial Statement and \$2,700 for the Fire Department of Montgomery Township Relief Association Audited Financial Statement.

Chairman Birch reported that budget amendments are required for internal and external reporting purposes. The Board proposed amendments include an adjustment to the Capital Reserve Fund for Designated Reserves for two technology upgrades, two new Police vehicles and the leveling and recoating the Fellowship Park tennis courts. Resolution #10, approved unanimously, approved the Third Quarter Budget Amendments to the General Fund, Capital Reserve Fund, Park and Recreation Fund and the Police Donation Fund Budgets for 2011.

Chairman Robert Birch made a motion to approve the payment of bills. Supervisor Michael Fox seconded the motion. The payment of bills was unanimously approved as submitted.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

BACKGROUND:

On August 22, 2011, the Board of Supervisors authorized Officer Brian Schreiber to attend Canine Handlers Training in Sanford, North Carolina. This team participated in two phases of training. On September 26, 2011, Officer Schreiber began training the first phase in Sanford, NC with Canine Bauer. The team was trained in building searches, article searches, obedience, agility and apprehension work. Additionally, they were training in narcotics detection of cocaine, heroin, marijuana and methamphetamine. On October 21, 2011, the team was certified by the training agency.

The second phase of training will consist of two additional weeks of intensive training under the direction of Canine Corporal Robert Hart, a certified Canine Trainer. During this phase of training the team will receive reinforced instruction in obedience, agility, tactical deployment, criminal apprehension, building searches, tracking and narcotic detection. Upon completion of this phase the team will be certified to begin their patrol duties.

Officer Adam Deussing started his career with our Police Department on August 3, 2007 as a recruit police officer. When he joined the Police Department he was an active member of the U.S. Coast Guard Reserves. Officer Deussing had joined the U.S. Coast Guard Reserves in January 2001, attending boot camp in Cape May, N.J. Upon completing boot camp he was assigned to Yorktown, VA where he earned the rating of a machinery technician.

Officer Deussing was subsequently assigned to a reserve unit in Manasquan, N.J. where he conducted search, rescue and law enforcement missions. He also obtained qualified crewmember letters on the 47' lifeboat.

In May 2006, he was transferred to Station Alexandria Bay on the St. Lawrence River in Alexandria Bay, NY. There he conducted missions with Customs and Border Patrol, local police and the Canadian Coast Guard.

In September 2006, he was transferred to Station Philadelphia where he currently drills. In September 2010. Officer Deussing was activated again and sent to Port Fourchon, LA, where he assisted in the Deepwater Horizon BP Oil Spill.

Throughout the years of service with the Coast Guard he has continued to advance through the ranks. On September 1, 2011, he received his anchors and was promoted to the rank of E-7, Chief Petty Officer. Within the next few weeks he will be attending the Chief Petty Officer Academy in California.

BACKGROUND:

On or around August 23, 2011, the National Weather Service began warning residents along the East coast of the United States of the potential impact of a Category 3 hurricane named Irene. As each day passed, the National Weather Service warned residents of the potential destruction this storm could cause if it made landfall. Locally, meteorologists were warning residents in the Delaware Valley of the potential for record flooding.

Given these reports, the various township departments and emergency service organizations began taking the following steps working cooperatively to protect the life and property of residents and visitors in Montgomery Township.

ADMINISTRATION

- Public education materials were placed on the website and cable regarding generator safety, usage of candles, and the "turn around, don't drown" program.
- Email notifications were sent out directing residents to check the website and cable channel for public education materials.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- Maintained situational awareness by monitoring weather forecasts and participated in a conference call with the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety.
- Worked with township administrative staff to prepare public education information.
- Chief Mann and Deputy Chief Bendig met with representatives of Neshaminy Falls to discuss concerns about flooding and evacuation procedures.
- Verified key staff and emergency contact information with all departments.

DEPARTMENT OF FIRE SERVICES & FIRE DEPARTMENT OF MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP

- Equipment was inspected and prepared for deployment as necessary.
- Volunteer crews manned the station from approximately 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 27th and remained in station until 7:30 a.m. on Monday, August 29th.
- During this time period, members of the FDMT responded to seventeen requests for assistance ranging from odors of natural gas to water in basements to subjects trapped in a vehicle by rising flood waters.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Equipment was inspected and prepared for deployment as necessary.
- The Department maintained normal staffing of officers on the street and command staff rotated through various shifts during the weekend.
- Deputy Chief Bendig contacted representatives from the North Penn School District to verify emergency contact information for the schools and transportation department in the event a shelter needed to be opened.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

- Equipment was inspected and prepared for deployment as necessary.
- Trucks were pre-stocked with barricades and stops signs to provide for a more efficient operation should the Township experienced a large-scale power outages.
- Twelve employees were activated at midnight and worked until approximately 10:00 a.m. on Sunday to complete the following tasks:
 - Removed several downed trees.
 - o Closed several roads and reopened when the water subsided.
 - O Cleared debris from basins, streams and storm inlets.
 - o Removed debris from roadways.
 - o Replaced storm water manhole lids that were displaced by water volume.

VMSC

None.

- 1 ALS ambulance added to the normal staffing; total of 5 ALS ambulances were on status.
- Additional personnel on call to staff up to 3 additional ambulances.
- Crews designated for the rescue truck and marine unit.
- Responded to seven water rescues and numerous other medical calls.

Luckily, Hurricane Irene passed by the New Jersey coast as a Category 1 hurricane and our Township did not experience the record flooding and damage that had been forecasted.

A little more than two weeks later, with the ground already saturated from record rainfalls during the month of August, our region was severely impacted by Tropical Storm Lee. Having just prepared for Hurricane Irene, all of our departments were well prepared to handle the relatively few calls for assistance

made by the residents of Montgomery Township. During this storm, crews from VMSC were dispatched to Lansdale Borough and Upper Dublin Township to assist with approximately 10 water rescues.

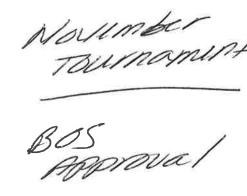

TEMPORARY SIGN SPECIAL EVENT - OUTDOOR SALES APPLICATION

A temporary event which may significantly impact public or private property, extend beyond the normal use or standards allowed by the zoning ordinance and exceeds normal vehicular and pedestrian traffic, may require the need for services of the Township's Police and Fire Departments. Such events include, but not limited to: entertainment, amusement, cultural recognition, sporting events, arts & crafts or trade shows, sidewalk sales, special seasonal events, special automobile sales/shows, fund raising events and grand openings. Activities may not inhibit or block safe access by emergency responders or adversely impact access and parking required to serve the facility. Company picnics are exempt; unless a temporary structure is erected, which may require a building permit. At the Regional Shopping Center, indoor special events require a permit but are not limited by the number of events per year. Temporary indoor retail sales at the Regional Shopping Center requires a separate permit.

Temporary sign permits shall be limited to **one (1) sign per street frontage**, no more than fourteen (14) times per calendar year. A temporary sign permit is limited to maximum of 7-days per permit. Permits are non-transferable. **Maximum ground sign permitted is 32 square feet set back 15' from the curb line and shall not obstruct view of traffic.** Permits for special events or outdoor sales shall be limited to no more than six (6) times per calendar year

Activities, such as hot air ballooning, skydiving events, hang gliding, bungee jumping, etc. as well as carnivals, circuses, festivals, fairs are not permitted unless the Zoning Hearing Board approves as a special exception. Fireworks displays (unless sponsored by the Township) are prohibited.

Application(s) **MUST** be submitted a minimum of **two (2) weeks** in advance of the event. A Temporary retail sales permit must be obtained by all vendors or merchants prior to issuance of permit, unless vendor is already registered with the Township.

The Second Class Township Code provides that personal property owned by the Township, with an estimated fair market value of which is one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, may only be sold by public bid or auction to the highest bidder after notice by advertisement.

In past years, the Township disposed of surplus vehicles and other assets through the firm of J.J. Kane Auctioneers by an auction process. J.J. Kane charges a consignment fee to the buyer of 10% and charges the Township a fee between 4% - 20% based on the overall sales revenue plus a share of the certain expenses such as advertising costs. We are required to deliver the equipment to their facility in Conshohocken. Generally the auction involves equipment from a number of municipalities however at times it is conducted with other agencies such as PECO.

The following four police vehicles have been taken out of service and are ready to be sent to the JJ Kane Auto Auction for their November 12, 2011 auction.
