MINUTES OF MEETING MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MARCH 10, 2014

Chairman Joseph Walsh called the Executive Session to order at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Robert Birch, Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox and Jeffrey McDonnell. Also in attendance were Robert lannozzi, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Chief J. Scott Bendig and Shannon Drosnock.

Chairman Joseph Walsh called the action meeting to order at 8:03 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Robert Birch, Candyce Fluehr Chimera, Michael Fox and Jeffrey McDonnell. Also in attendance were Robert Iannozzi, Esquire, Lawrence Gregan, Chief J. Scott Bendig, Richard Lesniak, Shannon Drosnock, Ann Shade, Stacy Crandell, Kevin Costello, Bruce Shoupe, Richard Grier and Shirley Snyder.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Chairman Joseph Walsh called for public comment from the audience and there was none.

Township Solicitor Robert lannozzi, Esquire reported that the Board had met in an executive session earlier in the evening at 7:00 p.m. Mr. lannozzi reported that the Board discussed two personnel matters and one potential litigation matter. Mr. lannozzi also reported that these matters are legitimate subjects of executive session pursuant to Pennsylvania's Sunshine Law.

Chairman Joseph Walsh made a motion and Vice Chairman Michael Fox seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the February 24, 2014 Board meeting. The minutes of the meeting were unanimously approved as submitted.

Director of Planning and Zoning Bruce Shoupe reported that Integral Development

Associates has submitted an application for conditional use approval to replace the Lane

Furniture store with The Tile Shop. There are no additions to the building or any changes to the existing parking, landscaping or loading areas. Resolution #1, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, authorized

the advertisement for a Public Hearing on Monday, April 14, 2014 after 8:00 p.m. at the Township building to consider the Conditional Use Application of Integral Development Associates for the leasing of a specialty retail store, The Tile Shop, to be located at 976 Bethlehem Pike.

Director of Planning & Zoning Bruce Shoupe reported that the policy of the Board of Supervisors has been to waive permit fees for non-profit and religious organizations within the Township. The Bharatiya Temple is requesting a waiver of the \$75 permit fee for a shed to be placed on their property. Resolution #2, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Robert Birch and adopted unanimously, approved the waiver of permit fee for the placement of a shed on the property of the Bharatiya Temple.

Bruce Shoupe reported that Mary Mother of the Redeemer Parish anticipates some building modifications to the Parish Office to provide a more accessible and safer entrance to the building, and some additional meeting rooms and work space. The Church is requesting a waiver of the land development process. The proposed addition will add 633 square feet of additional building area to the Rectory for these modifications. Staff has reviewed the plans and has determined that adequate parking and storm water management are in place for this addition and has recommended the waivers. Resolution #3, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, granted a waiver of the permit fee and requirement for a land development application to Mary Mother of the Redeemer Church for improvements to the Rectory.

Township Manager Lawrence Gregan reported that approval has been received from PennDOT to install left turn improvements to the traffic signal at the intersection of North Wales Road and Knapp Road. Some existing equipment in the Public Works Department inventory will be used for the improvements and some new equipment will need to be purchased to complete the project. Due to the need for all of this equipment to be compatible with existing

Econolite equipment, staff is requesting approval to purchase the additional equipment directly from Signal Control Products Inc. as the sole service provider of the Econolite equipment in this area. Resolution #4, made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, approved the expenditure of \$23,995 for the purchase of the necessary equipment to upgrade the traffic signal at North Wales Road and Knapp Road and further accept the proposal from Signal Control Products, Inc., Souderton, PA to provide equipment for the upgrade in accordance with their quote dated January 20, 2014 as the sole source provider for "Econolite" equipment in Southeastern Pennsylvania.

Resolution #5 made by Chairman Joseph Walsh, seconded by Vice Chairman Michael Fox and adopted unanimously approved Escrow Release #4 LDS #660 for Wegmans in the amount of \$673,348.00.

Director of Fire Services Richard Lesniak reported that Vision 20/20 National Strategies for Fire Loss Prevention hosts symposiums which provide participants with the opportunity to learn from fire service peers across the nation about successful fire prevention programs. This symposium is being held in Towson, Maryland. Resolution #6 made by Vice Chairman Michael Fox, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, authorized Director of Fire Services Richard Lesniak to attend the Third National Model Performance in Fire Prevention Symposium on March 26th, 27th and 28th in Towson, Maryland.

Chief of Police J. Scott Bendig announced that Unleashed by Petco, a small-scale neighborhood pet store will be opening in the Gwynedd Crossing Shopping Center. Unleashed by Petco would like to recognize the Montgomery Township Police Department's Canine Unit with a donation of \$1,500 for the Unit's work in the community. Resolution #7, made by Supervisor Robert Birch, seconded by Supervisor Candyce Fluehr Chimera and adopted unanimously, authorized the acceptance of the donation for the Montgomery Township Police



BACKGROUND:

In compliance with DEP regulations, the Township contracts with Republic Services, Inc. DBA BFI Waste Services of PA, LLC to provide curbside leaf and yard waste collection twice a year in the Fall and the Spring from residential properties in the Township. The Spring 2014 curbside leaf and yard waste collection is scheduled for Saturday, April 26, 2014.

In order to participate in the collection, residents must place the collected leaf and yard waste materials in biodegradable paper bags at the curb prior to 7:00AM that day for collection.

In addition to the curbside leaf waste collection on that day, the Township will be conducting their monthly leaf and yard waste drop off collection at William F. Maule Park at Windlestrae (Main Section/Kenas Road) from 8AM to Noon. This drop-off occurs monthly on the third Saturday of every month.

Leaf and yard waste materials collected are disposed of at the Barnside Farm Compost Facility (DEP approved compost facility) via a contract with the Northern Montgomery County Recycling Commission (NMCRC).

This information has been placed on the Township's website, cable channel and distributed by e-news to all registered participants.

- 1. The chosen disposal method to serve the proposed Giant to Go is by a tap-in of public sewer currently located on site. This is the ultimate method to serve the wastewater generated by the proposed development. The proposed Giant to Go will have estimated flows of 1,200 gallons per day.
- 2. The subject property is currently occupied by a one-story retail store and bordered by a gas station and other commercial properties. Properties adjoining are currently being served by public sewer operated by Montgomery Township Sewer Authority and treated by the Hatfield Township Municipal Authority Treatment Facility by means of the Ville-Glen Interceptor.
- 3. There currently is a projected hydraulic overload at Hatfield's Wastewater Treatment Facility resulting in a Chapter 94 connection prohibition. A Connection Management Plan has been approved for this project.
- 4. The Montgomery Township official plan is based on public sanitary sewer service for the subject tract.
- 5. There are currently no existing sewage management programs in this area.
- 6. Since Public Sewer is available within the limits of the proposed development and due to the nature of the project, a private facility would not be feasible since a private party would be responsible for maintaining such a system and since there are existing facilities already being maintained by the Montgomery Township Sewer Authority available to the site.
- 7. Due to the availability of the existing "public" sewage system within Horsham Road made this the viable method for providing sewer service for the proposed development. Connection to the public wastewater system will provide adequate sewage disposal for the development for the long-term as all of the components of the public system have adequate capacity to convey and treat the anticipated flows from the development.
- 8. The Hatfield Township Municipal Authority system is made up of several individual sections. The initial collection system is owned and operated by Montgomery Township Sewer Authority. The additional sections of the Hatfield Township Municipal Authority System would be the conveyance system which is shared by Hatfield Township Municipal Authority. Then treated at the Hatfield Wastewater Treatment Facility.

BACKGROUND:

In accordance with Pennsylvania ACT 205, an actuarial valuation of the Township's defined benefit pension plan is required to be performed on a biennial basis and reported to the Public Employee Retirement Commission (PERC). In preparing the 1/1/2013 Actuarial Valuation Report for the Township's defined benefit pension plan, plan actuary Tom Zimmerman, has advised that the Township has the option to continue to value the plan assets on an "actuarial smoothing" basis or change to a "market value" basis.

Given the strong performance of the assets of the plan in the market at the end of 2012 and through 2013, staff is recommending changing the valuation method of the plan assets to a straight "market value" basis. Using a market basis approach to valuing the plan assets is generally considered to be a more conservative approach, however in the current market, using the "market value" method would actually reduce the increase of the Township's annual Minimum Municipal Obligation (MMO) to the plan for years 2015 and 2016 from an approximate \$165K/year increase to \$135K/year increase.

BACKGROUND:

The Parks and Recreation Office currently accepts registrations for programs via mail and walk-in traffic only with no option for online registration. Registrations via the internet became a possibility with the implementation of the new Parks and Recreation Software, Capturepoint. Staff has researched the various options for accepting on-line registrations via credit card payments and is requesting authorization to move forward with the first step towards implementing this customer convenience.

In order to move forward, a relationship needs to be established with a merchant bank that will be responsible for handling the credit card payments used during the online registration and payment processing. Once this relationship is secured, a bank account will be opened with Univest, the Township's operating bank account provider, which will be segregated for credit card receipts only. Next, the IT departments of the merchant bank, the software provider and the Township will establish the necessary processes for the data to securely flow through the various channels. Lastly, the software module responsible for on-line registrations and payments will be tested and implemented onto the Township's website.

Staff received transaction fee quotes from five merchant banks. After analysis it was determined that Elavon will provide the lowest overall cost to the Township. Staff has confirmed that there are no costs associated with terminating a contract with Elavon should lower transaction costs become available through another provider. The Township Solicitor has reviewed the application/agreement.

Staff further recommends that the Township implement a convenience fee charge of 2.25% for on-line registration and payments.

The manner in which the fee structure is established is determined by the Township and bears no impact on the agreement with Elavon.
