#### 5. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

<u>Police Department</u>: See attached reports. In addition, the committee was briefed on recent crashes involving pedestrians, including a crash involving school-age children on December 19, 2018. Members of the committee requested further information regarding response protocols involving students waiting at bus stops. Chief Bendig will speak with school district personnel and report back to the committee at the next meeting.

<u>Public Works</u>: Director Costello advised that the Montgomery Township portion of the County Line Road Project has been completed. Director Costello also briefed the committee on the status of the adaptive signal system on Route 309 from the Five Points Intersection to Hilltown Township. A question arose regarding the traffic light preemption system. At this time the township uses a siren based preemption system but has applied for grants to convert lights to an optical preemption system.

### 6. **NEW BUSINESS:**

Recognition of Citizens for Lifesaving Acts of Service: A conversation ensued regarding the best method to recognize citizens for lifesaving acts of service (CPR/general acts of heroism). After discussion, it was agreed that Chief Bendig would reach out to the respective field experts and report back to the committee to determine if the specific actions of the individuals warrant recognition. Once determined, Chief Bendig will report back to the committee for further discussion on how best to recognize the lifesaving acts, if warranted.

Safety and Security Symposium for Faith Leaders: A member of the committee inquired if the police department was meeting with faith-based communities in light of recent violent incidents, On November 27, 2018, members of the department attended a Safety and Security Symposium for Faith Leaders in Montgomery County. Several faith-based leaders from Montgomery Township attended. Discussions ensued with members of the congregations, with the department offering its services to speak with the individual communities about their issues/concerns and possible solutions.
