#### **GENERAL MONTHLY MEETING**

#### 1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order by Matt Shinton.

#### 2. APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MONTH'S MINUTES:

Motion made to accept the June minutes by Matt Shinton.

Motion to accept the meeting minutes seconded by John O'Connor.

Motion carried 5-0.

#### 3. CORRESPONDENCE:

None received.

#### 4. OLD BUSINESS:

Unleashed Dogs in Township Parks: At the September 19, 2022, Public Safety Meeting, Township residents William and Ann James voiced their concerns regarding uncontrolled dogs running at large without a leash on the Zehr Fields at Windlestrae Park. An audit of similar calls for service in all Township Parks (except the Bark Park) in 2022 revealed three reported occurrences. At present time, The Township has no mechanisms in place requiring dogs to be on a leash within Township Parks. Currently, the Police Department utilizes a provision under the Pennsylvania Dog Law that does not require dogs to be on a leash, only *under the reasonable control of some person*. This matter will be discussed further at the October 24, 2022, Board of Supervisors Meeting. Supervisor Long requested that the Public Safety Committee members weigh in on the matter so she could brief the other Board of Supervisors on the Committee's thoughts regarding the issue. Three options were discussed:

- Option 1: Create and enact an addendum to the township ordinance governing park rules, adding a leash provision.
- Option 2: Continue to follow the Pennsylvania Dog Law regulating the control of dogs <u>and</u> crafting a sign to post in parks (near current rules) indicating:

## All dogs must be under control at all times 3 P.S. § 459-305

• Option 3: Continue to follow the Pennsylvania Dog Law regulating the control of dogs\_with no signage (current practice).

After discussion, the Public Safety Committee indicated that option 2 seemed most appropriate in their opinion considering the facts presented.

- Peter Erndwein performed the Annual Risk Control Survey of the Township on September 29, 2022.
- Responded to a total of 225 PA One Calls throughout the month.

#### 6. NEW BUSINESS

Trailer Parking on Dedicated Township Streets: Chief Bendig provided the Committee with an overview of a recent issue brought to the Department's attention regarding the parking of large trailers/large vehicles on dedicated Township streets, resulting in the minimization of available space for other vehicles. Several options were discussed with the Committee, including crafting an ordinance to regulate parking based upon factors to include the overall weight classification or size of the vehicles. This matter is currently under Township staff review. After discussion, the Public Safety Committee indicated that the option of restricting the parking of large trailers/large vehicles based on overall length was most appropriate, in their opinion considering the facts presented.

New Fireworks Law: Chief Wiegman provided the Committee with an overview of the amended Pennsylvania Fireworks Law, which provides a municipality the ability to craft an ordinance requiring the permitting of consumer fireworks, the prohibition of consumer fireworks, and the permitting of consumer fireworks by exception. Chief Wiegman also briefed the Committee about incidents the Fire Department encountered related to the use of fireworks. This matter is currently under Township staff review. After discussion, the Public Safety Committee indicated that the permitting of consumer fireworks by exception was most appropriate, in their opinion considering the facts presented.

Motion made to adjourn by Matt Shinton.

Motion to adjourn the meeting seconded by John O'Connor.






