2. & 3. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Long, and unanimously carried, Ms. Bamford was appointed to serve as the Temporary Chair.

4. Nomination and Election of Chairwoman:

Upon nomination by Ms. Long, seconded by Ms. Bamford, Ms. Chimera was nominated as Chairwoman. No other nominations were presented, and the Board unanimously elected Ms. Chimera as Chairwoman for 2023.

5. Nomination and Election of Vice Chairwoman:

Upon nomination by Ms. Ware, seconded by Ms. Chimera, Ms. Long was nominated as Vice Chairwoman. No other nominations were presented, and the Board unanimously elected Ms. Long as Vice Chairwoman for 2023.

6. Resolution 2023-01 – Establish Holidays, Meeting Dates, Official Appointments & Treasurer's Bond:

BUSINESS MEETING

1. Call to Order: The January 3, 2023 action meeting of the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Chairwoman Chimera at 7:10 p.m.

2. Public Comment: There was no public comment.

3. Consent Agenda:

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Long and unanimously carried, the minutes of the December 12, 2022 meeting, the Payment of Bills List dated January 3, 2023, Escrow Release No. 1 – Caracausa Building Development and Escrow Release No. 3 – Westrum – CSW Luxor VII Montgomeryville were approved as presented.

Administration and Finance:

5. Ratification of Real Estate Tax Appeal Settlement: Ms. McCreary reported that the North Penn School District filed an appeal for the property tax related to 1250 Welsh Road. The assessed valuation is \$2,062,180.00 and the School District presented information to the Board of Assessment Appeals (BOAA) to increase the assessment with the BOAA upholding the existing one. The school district was positioned to appeal the decision and a settlement was negotiated by the School District's Solicitor and the property owner's attorney. Based on the proposed settlement, the Township would receive \$5,719.03, representing an additional \$584.20 in real estate tax revenue for 2023.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Bamford and unanimously carried, the Board approved the stipulated settlement for 1250 Welsh Road and authorized the Township Solicitor to execute the document on behalf of the Township.



5. Disposal of Non-Permanent Township Records:

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Long, and unanimously carried, the Board approved the disposal of non-permanent Township records as noted.

6. Revised Finance Committee Bylaws: Mr. Shapiro reported that at their last meetings, the Finance Committee discussed meeting quarterly instead of monthly. The committee would continue to be provided with a monthly packet including financial statements and any other information they are currently provided. As a result, the Finance Committee bylaws must be revised to reflect the change in meeting times.

MOTION: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera, seconded by Ms. Long and unanimously carried, the Board approved the revisions to the Finance Committee Bylaws.

Other Business:

Under other business, Ms. Chimera thanked Ms. Bamford for serving as Chairwoman for the past three years, noting that she did a great job steering the Township through some unknown times. Ms. Chimera stated that it was admirable, and she thanked Ms. Bamford on behalf of the entire Township. Ms. Bamford thanked everyone for their support during her tenure as Chairwoman, stating it was an honor and she appreciated having the support of so many people, including her peers and colleagues on the Board of Supervisors, as well as our phenomenal staff, who really made it easy and made the Board look good. Thank you to everyone.

7. Adjournment: Upon motion by Ms. Chimera and seconded by Ms. Long, the meeting was adjourned at 7:17 p.m.

BACKGROUND:

Later this month, a newly created Professional Standards position will be filled by a current Sergeant within the organization. As a result of this restructuring, a supervisory vacancy will exist within the Department.

In October of 2021, a multiple-phase promotional process was initiated to establish a list of eligible candidates for promotion to the rank of Sergeant. This process included both a written examination and an oral review board. After this highly competitive process, Officer John Rushin is recommended for promotion to the rank of Sergeant.

Officer Rushin is a 2012 graduate of the Montgomery County Community College Municipal Police Academy. On December 17, 2012, Officer Rushin was sworn in as a police officer with the Montgomery Township Police Department and assigned to the Patrol Division. The municipalities located in the Wissahickon Creek Watershed are obligated under the PA DEP's MS4 and NPDES programs to meet the municipality's MS4, NPDES and TMDL obligations. In 2016, US EPA was poised to issue a new TMDL for the Wissahickon Creek Watershed, which would have included a new Total Phosphorus TMDL, which is believed to include requirements that are unachievable.

As a result, in 2016, the Wissahickon Clean Water Partnership was established to develop an Alternative to the proposed EPA Total Phosphorus TMDL. The Township is one of the founding members of the Wissahickon Clean Water Partnership. The group is comprised of municipalities, the City of Philadelphia, and other stakeholders including the Pennsylvania Environmental Council, and the Wissahickon Valley Watershed Association.

Tonight, Brandon Ford, Watershed Partnership Co-Chair, and Erin Landis, Water Programs Manager with Wissahickon Trails will speak to the Board about the initiative and update you on where we currently are with regard to the proposed water quality plan and its implementation.

ORDINANCE NO. 23-332

AN ORDINANCE OF MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ADOPTING THE 2018 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE AS THE TOWNSHIP FIRE PREVENTION CODE

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township has enacted the Code of Ordinances of Montgomery Township which includes, inter alia, provisions governing fire & life safety in Montgomery Township; and

WHEREAS, said enacting Ordinance does prescribe a procedure for amendments to the code; and WHEREAS, Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors enacted Ordinance No 96-70 which established a commercial fire inspection program to allow fire inspections of non-residential properties within Montgomery Township that is codified under Chapter 69 of the Montgomery Township Code;

and

WHEREAS, Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors authorizes the Township to conduct Life Safety & Fire Inspections, General Safety Inspections, and Fire & Code Inspections consistent with nationally recognized standards and the 2018 International Fire Code;

and

WHEREAS, Chapter 69 of the Montgomery Township Code authorizes the Township to charge inspection fees as part of the annual fire inspection program in order to cover the costs associated with the administration, inspection, and enforcement;

and

WHEREAS, Chapters 69 and 80 permit the Township to establish such inspection fees by resolutions; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery Township desires to set for the fees applicable to the fire inspection program as recommended by the Fire Marshal by amending the Township's Fee Schedule

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has determined that the recommended adoption of the 2018 International Fire Code and its Appendices as the Township Fire Prevention Code to the Code of Ordinances, as recommended by the Fire Marshal, has merit and desires to implement this adoption in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Montgomery Township;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same as follows:

I. That a certain document, copies of which are on file in the office of the Fire Marshal of Montgomery Township, being marked and designated as the *International Fire Code*, 2018 edition, including Appendix 1 & Chapters B, C, D, E, F(these are already adopted under the UCC adoption), as published by the International Code Council, be and is hereby adopted as the Fire Code of Montgomery Township, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania regulating and governing the safeguarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Fire Code on file in the office of the Fire Marshal are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this legislation, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Effect on New Construction; Conflicts with UCC

This Chapter shall not apply to new construction that is otherwise regulated or under construction through permits issues under the Pennsylvania Unified Construction Code and the International Codes which are mandatorily adopted by the Township of Montgomery thereunder (collectively the "UCC")

To limit the extent of any conflicts between the provisions of the UCC (including, without limitation, the International Fire Code to the extent that the International Fire Code is referenced by the International Building Code). The provisions of the UCC shall apply.

- II. That the following sections are hereby revised:
 - A. Section 101.1. Insert: Montgomery Township, Montgomery County
 - B. Section 103.1, General, shall be modified and read as follows: Add: The Department of Fire Services (Prevention) is established within the jurisdiction and under the direction of the Fire Marshal/ Fire Chief. The Fire Marshal/Fire Chief shall be in charge of the operation of this Department and its function shall be the implementation, administration, and enforcement of the provisions of this code.
 - C. Section 103.2, Appointment, shall be deleted and the following language substituted: Add: The Fire Marshal/Fire Chief position shall be filled as prescribed in the Code of the Township of Montgomery. The Fire Marshal/Fire Chief shall be appointed by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors, and the Fire Marshal/Fire Chief shall not be removed from office except for cause and after full opportunity to be heard on specific and relevant charges by and before the appointing authority. The Fire Marshal/Fire Chief will be the Township's Fire Code Official.
 - D. Sections 105, Permits, shall read as follows:
 Add: The Fire Chief is authorized to issue operational permits subsequent to Life Safety & Fire Inspections.

E. Section 107 Inspections

Add: The Fire Chief is authorized to appoint Fire Inspectors to conduct Life Safety & Fire Inspections in Montgomery Township. Appointed Fire Inspectors will meet the following minimum qualifications

- 1. Employee of Montgomery Township & the Montgomery Township Department of Fire Services.
- 2. Possession of a valid Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry Uniform Construction Code Certification Card as a Fire Inspector.
- 3. Nationally Certified Fire Inspector 1 NFPA 1031

Add: The Fire Chief and appointed Fire Inspectors shall conduct Life Safety & Fire Inspections not less the 1 year since the occupancies last inspection. Additional inspections may be required based upon further investigation and or information received.

Add: The Fire Chief is authorized to conduct Re-Tenant Inspections of new Tenant spaces of commercial occupancies when there is a change of ownership and/or tenant.

Add: Businesses are required to send their annual sprinkler, fire alarm and NFPA inspections report to the Fire Chief.

- F. Section 110.4. Insert: Summary, not to exceed \$1,000, 30 days Add: The Fire Chief and authorized Fire Inspectors may file Non-Traffic Summary Citations with the District Magistrate's Office for violations of a provision of this code.
- G. Section 202 shall have the following definitions added:

FIRE MARSHAL -- The Fire Marshal of Montgomery Township, who shall also be the Fire Chief and Fire Official as referred to in this code

(Ordinance Number 22-237, adopted 1-24-2022)

H. Section 307 Recreational Fires

Add: Homeowners shall have an annual site inspection completed by the Fire Code Official or Fire Inspector. The Fire Chief will issue a Recreational Fire Permission Letter that expires 12 months after date that letter is issued. Homeowner must comply with the requirements on the letter as well as this code.

- Section 506 Lock Boxes
 Add: The key box shall be a Knox Box. The Knox Box will be installed at a location that is that is approved by the Fire Chief.
 Township Code 69-3 Knox Box
- J. Current Codes Previously Adopted
 - a. 69-8 & 9 BOCA Fire Code, 1996
 - b. 69-16 NFPA Life Safety Code, 1994
 - c. Ordinance 04-188 Truss Placard
- *K.* All geographic limits referred to in certain sections of the 2018 International Fire Code are to comply with the Montgomery Township Zoning Code.

III. All ordinances of parts thereof inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

IV. The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Ordinance or on the provisions of the Code of Ordinances of Montgomery Township.

V. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

BACKGROUND:

In 2017 the Pennsylvania legislature passed legislation permitting Pennsylvania residents over the age of 18 to purchase, possess and use consumer-grade fireworks. Many municipalities and fire service professionals expressed concern about the legislation and its impact.

In 2022 Act 74 was signed into law which amended the prior legislation and gave municipalities the power to enact conditions, prohibitions, and limitations on the use and sale of fireworks provided they do not conflict with this new legislation.

The PA Municipal League provided its members with model ordinances for elected officials to consider adopting. Staff reviewed the ordinances and presented them to the Public Safety Committee. The consensus of staff and the members of the committee is for the Board to consider adopting the use of consumer fireworks by exception involving a permit process.

At the December 12, 2022, public meeting, the Board of Supervisors authorized the advertisement of the proposed ordinance. The Solicitor's office has confirmed the ordinance was properly advertised. We have not received any public comment on this matter.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board adopt the ordinance.

MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ORDINANCE NO. 23-333

AN ORDINANCE OF MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 108, FIREWORKS, IN SECTION II, GENERAL LEGISLATION OF THE MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP CODE OF ORDINANCES REGULATING THE USE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS AND DISPLAY FIREWORKS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP AND PROVIDING FOR PERMITS IN CERTAIN CASES.

WHEREAS, Act 74 of 2022, House Bill 2157, P.N. 3332 was adopted by the General Assembly on July 6, 2022, was signed by the Governor on July 11, 2022, amends Title 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter 11 (hereafter, "Fireworks Law" or "Law"), and became effective on September 9, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law governs the sale, purchase and use of Consumer Fireworks and Display Fireworks in the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law authorizes Pennsylvania municipalities to restrict or prohibit certain uses of Consumer Fireworks as defined in the Law if the municipality determines that certain conditions are met; and

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law authorizes the adoption of local rules and regulations by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors that govern permit approvals; and

WHEREAS, Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors has determined that the full authority provided by the Fireworks Law should be exercised in the interests of public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors has determined after conducting appropriate inquiries during its meetings and after receiving public comment, that use of Consumer Fireworks within Montgomery Township limits would violate the prohibition in the Fireworks Law and specifically Sections 1106(a)(1.2) and 1104(b)(5) (relating to use of consumer fireworks), and would be contrary to the public interest and harmful to public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors desires to regulate the use of Display Fireworks and Consumer Fireworks Montgomery Township limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery Township, and it is hereby **ENACTED** and **ORDAINED** by authority of same

I.

PART II, CHAPTER 108: FIREWORKS

§108-1 Definitions

For purposes of this Ordinance, the definitions of "Consumer Fireworks" and "Display Fireworks" shall be that set forth in Section 1 of the Fireworks Law, appearing here as Attachment "A" to this Ordinance, and any successor legislation. As set forth therein, the term "Consumer Fireworks" shall not include devices such as "ground and hand-held sparkling devices," "novelties," or "toy caps."

§108-2 Display Fireworks

2.1 In accordance with the Fireworks Law, a permit is required before any use of Display Fireworks within Montgomery Township limits. Permit application forms are available through the Office of Planning and Zoning during normal business hours. The application must include facts sufficient to establish that the Display Fireworks will not be ignited within 300 feet of sales locations for Consumer Fireworks and that the Display Fireworks will be handled by a competent operator at least 21 years of age who demonstrates evidence of fireworks handling and safety training, all in accordance with Sections 1102 and 1107 of the Fireworks Law. The application must include the approval of the Chief of the Fire Department or other appropriate official as may be designated by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors and that the Display Fireworks will not be located, discharged or fired in such a manner as to be hazardous to property or an endangerment to any person. The application shall be accompanied by a certificate of insurance in accordance with Subsection 1102(d) of the Law. The applicant must acknowledge acceptance of the requirements otherwise established by state and federal law. Permit extensions shall be permitted in accordance with Subsection 1102(e) provided the extension sought receives a renewed approval by the designated official that the extended use would not be hazardous to property or an endangerment to any person.

2.2 In accordance with Section 1105(a) of the Law, the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors may under this Ordinance grant permits for the use of Display Fireworks for agricultural purposes in connection with the raising of crops and the protection of

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crops from bird and animal damage. The application for such a permit must meet the requirements of this Section. A permit under Section 1105 shall remain in effect for the calendar year in which it was issued. Sales, possession and use of Display Fireworks for the purpose stated in the permit shall be lawful for that purpose only.

2.3 Applications for use of Display Fireworks shall be submitted at least 8 weeks prior to the date of proposed use. Permits for the use of Display Fireworks may be granted by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors, or by such official or officials as are so designated by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors upon approval of the application and payment of a fee which shall be fixed by Resolution by the Township Board of Supervisors.

§108-3 Consumer Fireworks

3.1 In accordance with the Fireworks Law, and based upon legislative findings that there is no location within the Montgomery Township limits that meets statutory requirements, including but not limited to the prohibition of use within 150 feet of a building or vehicle, the use of Consumer Fireworks within those limits in accordance with Section 1104(b)(5) of the Law is hereby prohibited.

3.2 Upon proper application as hereafter prescribed, a use within the Montgomery Township limits may be permitted as an exception when it is demonstrated that the proposed use by exception can be conducted without violating the prohibitions set forth in paragraph 3.1 and Section 1104(b)(5) of the Law.

3.3 Permit application forms for a use by exception are available through the Office of Planning and Zoning during normal business hours. The application for use by exception must include facts sufficient to establish in accordance with

Section 1104 of the Law that the provisions relating to Consumer Fireworks will not be violated, including facts sufficient to demonstrate (1) that no one under the age of 21 will purchase, possess or use Consumer Fireworks; (2) that Consumer Fireworks will not be used on private property or on public property, including, but not limited to, streets, parking lots, sidewalks and parks, without the express permission of the owner or entity that controls the property; (3) that

the Consumer Fireworks will not be used within, directed at or directed from a "vehicle" or "building" as those two terms are defined in the Law; (4) that the Consumer Fireworks will not be directed at another person; (5) that the Consumer Fireworks will not be used by a person who is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug; and (6) that the Consumer Fireworks will not be used within 150 feet of a building or vehicle, whether or not the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the Consumer Fireworks.

3.4 In accordance with Section 1104 of the Fireworks Law, no permit shall be granted for the use by exception of Consumer Fireworks within 150 feet of an Animal Housing Facility as defined in the Law, or a fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person. A permit may be granted on the basis of an application that meets the requirements of Section 1104 for use of Consumer Fireworks at a distance of 150 to 300 feet if the prospective user of the Consumer Fireworks provides proof of notification in writing to the owner or manager of the animals or livestock of the prospective use at least 72 hours in advance.

3.5 Applications for use by exception of Consumer Fireworks shall be received at least 8 weeks prior to the date of proposed use. Permits for the use by exception of Consumer Fireworks may be granted by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors, or by such official or officials as are so designated by Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors upon approval of the application and payment of a fee of an amount established by Resolution by the Township Board of Supervisors.

3.6 The permit shall restrict the use by exception of Consumer Fireworks to the day and time listed in the application but in no event shall the permit allow use later than 10:00 P.M., provided however, that (1) on July 2, 3 and 4 and December 31, Consumer Fireworks may be used until 1:00 A.M. on the following day, and (2) when July 4 falls on a Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, Consumer Fireworks may be used until 1:00 A.M. on the following Friday and Saturday. Pursuant to Subsection 1106 (b) of the Law, the hours of use of Consumer Fireworks may not be restricted on the Monday of Memorial Day and the immediately preceding Saturday and Sunday, and the Monday of Labor Day and the immediately preceding Saturday and Sunday.

3.7 No permission is granted by the Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors to any person to ignite or discharge Consumer Fireworks on the streets or sidewalks in Montgomery Township or on any property owned or occupied by Montgomery Township or other governmental entity, including without limitation, all of Montgomery Township's parks and buildings.

§108-4 Certified copies of this Ordinance shall be provided to the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas and all Magisterial Judges within Montgomery Township, posted on Montgomery Township's website and made available to the public at the Office of Planning and Zoning.

§108-5 Nothing in this Ordinance governs the sale of Consumer Fireworks for the period of one year from the effective date of the Fireworks Law in accordance with Section 1106(a)(2) of the Law.

§108-6 6.1 In accordance with the provisions of Section 1114(1) of the Law, any person using Consumer Fireworks in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance, for the first offense commits a summary offense, and upon conviction shall, in addition or any other penalty authorized by law, be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars. A subsequent offense under this Ordinance committed within three years of a prior conviction shall constitute a summary offense, and upon conviction shall, in addition to any other penalty authorized by law, be punishable of a fine of not more than One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars.

6.2 Any person selling Consumer Firework in violation of the Law is punishable in accordance with Section 1114(2) be punishable by a fine of not less than \$10,000.

6.3 Any person selling or using Display Fireworks in violation of the Law is punishable in accordance with Section 1114(3) by a fine of not less than \$10,000.

II. REPEALER

All ordinances or resolutions or parts ordinances or resolutions insofar as they are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and rescinded.

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III. SEVERABILITY

In the event any provision, section, sentence, clause or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not effect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this Ordinance; it being the intent of Montgomery Township that the remainder of the Ordinance shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days following its legal enactment.

BACKGROUND:

In 2023, the Police Department is scheduled to replace two police vehicles. After researching available models and powertrains, the Police Department proposes purchasing two 2023 Ford Police Interceptor Utility models and equipment as approved in the 2023 Final Budget.

The 2023 Ford Police Interceptor Utility models will replace the following police vehicles:

- 2017 Ford Police Interceptor Utility with 99,985 miles and 6,034 engine hours.
- 2009 Dodge Charger with 79,369 miles.

Due to manufacturer production delays, the Department is requesting authorization to place the order for the vehicles at this time. Attached are quotes dated December 26, 2022, from Fred Beans Ford Lincoln, an authorized vendor under the Co-Stars Cooperative Purchase Program (Contract # 025-E22-255), to provide the requested vehicles at a total cost of \$79,782.00. This cost is 17% off the manufacturer's total suggested retail price of \$95,980.00 and represents a savings of \$16,198.00. The equipment meets the specifications prepared by the Police Department.

Attached are quotes dated August 24, 2022, from Havis Inc., an authorized vendor under the Co-Stars Cooperative Purchase Program (Contract # 012-E22-299), to provide the requested vehicle equipment and installation at a total cost of \$27,545.43. This cost is over 23% off the manufacturer's total suggested retail price of \$36,141.41, representing a savings of \$8595.98. The equipment meets the specifications prepared by the Police Department.

The total cost to replace these two police vehicles, including equipment and installation, is \$107,327.43.

BUDGET IMPACT:

A total of \$126,000.00 was included in the 2023 Approved Final Budget-Police Department Capital Replacement to purchase police vehicles and emergency lighting.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors approves the awarding of the contracts for the referenced purchases per the 2023 approved Final Budget.

MOTION/RESOLUTION:

Motion to award the contract for the purchase of two 2023 Ford Police Interceptor Utility vehicles from Fred Beans Ford Lincoln, an authorized vendor under the Co-Stars Cooperative Purchase Program, at a total cost of \$79,782.00 per their quote.



The Glock sidearms were last replaced in 2014. Since that time, these sidearms have been exposed to extreme conditions. They are beginning to show the general wear and tear that comes with nine years of sidearm qualifications, training, and practice, with thousands of rounds being put through each sidearm. The Department proposes replacing these sidearms with a similar sidearm, holsters, and sighting system that will significantly improve accuracy.

This item is not available to be purchased on COSTARS. Per the 2023 Pennsylvania bidding thresholds, purchases and contracts over \$22,500 require formal bidding.

The property sits within the LI District with ECPOD Overlay and was developed under the ECPOD regulations. The applicant proposes to demo the existing building (former Applebee's) and construct a new 4,005 building with drive-through and 480 sq ft outdoor dining patio. The applicant proposes signage related to the drive-through operations including a Clearance Bar sign, Menu Board, and Drive-thru Canopy with speakers. The applicant is requesting relief from the provisions of Section 230-123A(36) *Miscellaneous Signs* of the Code of Montgomery Township in the form of a Special Exception for the proposed signage.

2. <u>Application #23010002 DiAntonia / 112 Schreiner Drive</u> - The applicants own and reside in a single family home located at 112 Schreiner Drive. MONTGOMERY TOWNSHIP 2022 ANNUAL WORK PLAN

<u>Arbor Day 2022</u>– This year, the Annual Arbor Day Tree Give-Away was held on Saturday, April 23rd, 2022 at the Montgomery Township Building Gazebo Park. The day's events included the reading of the Arbor Day Proclamation, the distribution of 225 free native shade and ornamental trees to residents, and the presentation of the 2021 Tree City USA Certification and Growth Award to Montgomery Township. Township staff, Landscape Architect, and several volunteers were on hand to provide tree selection, care, and maintenance advice to our residents. The trees cost \$2,788.75.

Basin Naturalization Program – Reassessments were completed on 13 basins that were previously assessed in 2015 and 2016. Overall, most basins have progressed nicely. Biggest problem was blocked access to structures and suggested adding riprap to some of these basins. This project was completed at a cost of \$6247.04.

<u>2022 Planting Projects</u>: The existing overgrown landscaping at the Memorial Grove along the trail and benches were removed and replaced with 21 new plantings by Holly Days Nursery at a cost of \$3,600.

<u>2022 Community Forestry Workshop</u> - Montgomery Township and Bartlett Tree Experts hosted our annual Workshop on November 4th of this year. The full day event was held at the Community Center with 39 attendees (30% increase over last year), 6 volunteer speakers, and staff. PA Pesticide, ISA, and PLNA PCH credits were approved and made available for all attendees.

<u>Welcome to the Township Signage Research & Design</u> – An inventory of current signage, their locations, and future locations were discussed. The Commission spent the year researching existing signage and locations, designing future signage, and researched new locations for proposed signage at major entry points into the Township for the Board of Supervisors consideration. Landscaping will also be incorporated into each location with the signage taking into consideration visibility, location, and maintenance.

Montgomery Township - Additional Projects / Achievements

Montgomery Township's Environmental Advisory Committee held a presentation on June 22, 2022 for the residents with a representative from Ambler Greener and Penn State Extension sharing their vast knowledge of rain gardens and native plants. The presentation included installing rain gardens in residential landscapes. They provided handouts and additional resources as well for follow up.

Montgomery Township's Environmental Advisory Committee created a "Tuesday Tips" Campaign on Township Social Media to provide guidance and resource information to residents throughout the year addressing topics relative to each season.

An evaluation of the current dog park was completed. It was determined that the construction of a new dog park in a more accessible location would be more economical and beneficial to residents than refurbishing the existing park. The existing dog park is difficult to locate, parking is on land not owned by the Township, ADA improvements would be difficult, easements would need to be obtained for necessary improvements and access, and any drainage improvements would require cutting of several large trees, engineering & construction costs, and may not alleviate the drainage problems. The existing dog park is recommended to remain a natural area and a new dog park is proposed to be constructed on a better suited Township owned property.

The Taxpayer filed an appeal for the property tax for the 2021 Tax Year. The assessed value for 119 Garden Golf Boulevard was \$12,572,000.00. Based upon the applicable Common Level Ratio, the implied market value for the property for the 2021 Tax Year would be \$26,805,970.15. On September 18, 2020, after the Taxpayer presented information to the Board of Assessment Appeals ("BOAA") the BOAA adjusted the assessed value of the property to \$10,576,000.00. Based upon the applicable Common Level Ratio, relying upon the adjusted assessed value of the property, the implied market value for the property for the 2021 Tax Year would be \$22,550,106.61.

BUDGET IMPACT:

Based on the proposed settlement, the Taxpayer will immediately receive a refund of \$2,480.85 for the 2021 Tax Year, and a refund of \$5,186.67 for the 2022 tax year. The assessment for the Property will be decreased to \$7,524,000.00 for the 2023 tax year

The Solicitor's office has reviewed the proposed settlement and recommends the Board of Supervisors approve the settlement.

Subject: January Finance Committee Report

Attached is a revenue and expenditure report as of 12/31/22 for the Montgomery Township 2022 budget. The financials are unaudited and still require year-end adjustments and accruals.

2022 Budget Summary - as of 12/31/22:

The General Fund's total revenues are \$17,200,998 or 123.84% of the total budget. Primary revenue sources (Act 511 Taxes) comprise \$12,612,165 of the total revenues. Total Real Estate Taxes collection for the year is 101.11%.

Total Real Estate Taxes budgeted for 2022 was \$4,722,500 in the General, Fire, Park, and Debt Service Funds. Year-to-date collections are \$4,770,209, or 101.01%.

Earned Income tax for all funds is at 119.81% or \$6,877,005.

Mercantile Tax collections is at 139.44%, or \$2,509,943. For the same period in 2021, \$1,864,258 was collected for this revenue.

Business Privilege Tax is at 119.55% or 1,075,970. For the same period in 2021, \$1,024,700 was collected for this revenue.

Both taxes were due on March 15th.

- Staff requested data from Berkheimer regarding the higher collections of Mercantile and Business Tax. A business is required to submit two payments each year based on gross receipts.
 - Payment #1 A current year estimate based on the previous year's actual gross receipts.
 - Payment #2 A reconciliation of the previous year's actual versus that year's estimate. Meaning in 2021 a business submitted payment #1. In 2022 when reconciling actual numbers, if the actual is higher than the estimated, then they owe the additional tax.

- For collections in 2022, there is an effect from 2020. In 2021 business's actuals were lower than in previous years. Businesses estimated a lower tax in 2021. This estimated lower tax in 2021 caused the increase in revenue for 2022 as those businesses owe the additional tax, as indicated in payment #2.
- Berkheimer has estimated an additional \$600,000 of revenue was collected due to this. When you subtract out the \$600,000 the actual collection is roughly \$1.8 million, which is on par with previous years.
- When budgeting for 2023, this year should be considered an anomaly, and past budget trends should be used as indicators.

The Real Estate Transfer Tax is at 219.08% on an accrual accounting basis or \$1,971,746. If the one-time transfers of the Mall and redeterminations are deducted, this revenue is at 115.67% or \$1,041,019.

Total General Fund expenditures are \$14,179,869 or 100.34% of the total budget.

For 2022, the major operating categories in the General Fund, were below the 2022 budgeted amounts. Unbudgeted interfund transfers of \$800,000 contributed to the overall General Fund expenditure budget to be above the 2022 budgeted amount. The interfund transfer was approved by the Board of Supervisors due to the one-time revenues received by major real estate transfers.

Legal Services, 01-404-4314 is \$25,604 over the 2022 budget of \$205,000. \$108,254 of those costs is related to the Zehr litigation.

Engineering Services, 01-408 is over budget by \$16,827. Within that category, 01-408-4313, General Engineering, is over budget by \$26,078. Majority of the expenditures in this line item are general engineering and traffic services.

Buildings and Grounds is \$161,938 over budget. The line-item Building Maintenance is over budget by \$43,446. Most of that cost is due to contracted services for janitorial services. A decrease in Public Works salaries and wages will offset this.

Police Fleet is over budget by \$19,532, which is due to increase fuel costs.

Expense category 01-432 (Snow and Ice Removal) is over budget by \$37,400 due to unbudgeted expenses of \$32,947 and \$11,190 in Salaries and Wages, and Overtime. In years past, these expenses were not recorded in this expense category. In the 2022 budget, these costs were budgeted in expense category 01-430 (Public Works), which will cause an offset in those line items.

In Fund 04, line item 04-413-4131, Overtime is at 118.99% of the budget. The Fire Department was awarded a grant for installing fire alarms in residential properties. The FDMT submitted a payment in the amount of \$16,405 to offset these costs.

In Fund 08, line item 08-400-4700, Capital Purchases, is over budget by \$15,678. This was for installing two LED solar lights at the CRC parking lot. The Township received a grant in 2021, which paid for the entire cost of this project.

Department Notes

The 2022 audit is scheduled for the last week of March.

Staff has started the conversion process of the legacy software, BS&A, to the new software, Tyler. Implementation is tentatively scheduled for mid-year.



On December 2, 2022, Officer Rushin and Officer Long attended the History of Policing and Cultural Diversity training at the Montgomery County Public Safety Training Campus.

On December 5, 2022, Detective Walter attended a Conversation Management Interview Skills training at the Middle Atlantic-Great Lakes Organized Crime Law Enforcement Network (MAGLOCLEN) in Newtown, PA

On December 14, 2022, Officer Deussing attended Major Incident Response Team (MIRT) training at the Montgomery County Public Safety Training Campus.

NOTED INCIDENTS:

On December 4, 2022, officers conducted a traffic stop on a blue Honda on Bethlehem Pike at JL Freed Honda for a vehicle code violation. Officers approached the vehicle and spoke with the driver. While speaking with the driver, officers observed drug paraphernalia in plain view and noted inconsistent statements. An exterior canine search of the vehicle was conducted, indicating the presence of drugs. The vehicle was impounded. A search warrant for the vehicle was applied for and granted. A search of the vehicle yielded crack cocaine, heroin, and drug paraphernalia. The driver was charged with violations of the Drug Act and related offenses.

On December 4, 2022, officers responded to Bethlehem Pike and North Wales Road for a suspicious vehicle. While responding, officers received information that a white Toyota was following the caller and that the occupants were yelling at her and running red lights in an attempt to keep up with her vehicle. Officers located and conducted a traffic stop of the white Toyota in the parking lot of the Lukoil on Bethlehem Pike. Officers approached the vehicle and spoke with the driver and five passengers. While speaking with the occupants, officers observed an AR-15 rifle along the floorboard of the rear passenger seat of the vehicle. The rifle was removed from the vehicle. Consent to search the vehicle was requested and granted. A search of

the vehicle yielded a knife, marijuana, and additional ammunition for the rifle. Further investigation revealed that the rifle was stolen from a vehicle in Hatfield Township. Three of the vehicle occupants were taken into custody and charged with firearm possession as a minor, possession of a loaded weapon, receiving stolen property, and violations of the Drug Act. The cell phones of the occupants were seized in conjunction with the investigation. Search warrants for cell phones were applied for and granted. The investigation has revealed that the occupants are involved in multiple thefts of vehicles, theft from vehicles, and various burglaries in the area. The investigation is ongoing.

On December 4, 2022, a canine team responded to Plumstead Township to assist their officers in locating a despondent subject. The canine team met with officers, who advised that the subject left the residence on foot after threatening to harm herself. A canine track was initiated, which led to a nearby wooded area. The canine track continued into the wooded area, where the canine located the subject sitting on a log. The subject was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation and medical treatment.

On December 6, 2022, officers received information from Lower Gwynedd Police Department regarding four subjects that had just stolen catalytic converters in their municipality. Officers were advised that the subjects fled in a black Ford and were traveling into Montgomery Township. Officers began checking areas within the Township that have encountered similar types of thefts and encountered four subjects in a vehicle on Commerce Drive matching the description. Officers approached the vehicle and spoke with the occupants. Officers noted their nervous behavior and inconsistent stories. While speaking with the officers, the subjects fled on foot towards Horsham Road and Stump Road, entering the Village of Neshaminy Falls Development. Additional officers from surrounding agencies responded to the area to assist in the search. After an extensive search, all four subjects were located and taken into custody. The subjects were turned over to Lower Gwynedd Township for prosecution.

On December 7, 2022, officers responded to the Wegmans on Bethlehem Pike for a retail theft in progress. While responding, officers were advised that three subjects left the area in a white Ford with unpaid merchandise totaling \$1,414.53. Officers began checking the area, locating the vehicle traveling on Bethlehem Pike. Officers conducted a traffic stop of the vehicle on Bethlehem Pike and Welsh Road. A Wegmans employee was brought to the traffic stop and identified the subjects as being involved in the theft. All three subjects were taken into custody. It was subsequently learned that two of the subjects had collected the merchandise, then employed the third subject, a juvenile, to proceed past the points of sale. The two adults were charged with retail theft and corruption of minors. The juvenile was transported back to the Department and picked up by a family member.

On December 9, 2023, officers responded to JL Freed Honda on Bethlehem Pike for a theft report. Upon arrival, officers met with the complainant, who advised that over twenty vehicles had their catalytic converters and wheel center caps stolen. Video surveillance was reviewed, showing two subjects dressed in dark clothing entering the parking lot under cover of darkness after hours. After approximately one hour, the subjects were seen fleeing the parking lot after an officer initiated an unrelated traffic stop close to the dealership. Evidence was collected from the scene. This investigation is ongoing.

On December 13, 2022, officers conducted a traffic stop on a red Chevrolet on North Wales Road and Horsham Road for a motor vehicle violation. Officers approached the vehicle and spoke with the driver and backseat passenger. While speaking with the driver, officers noted the odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. Officers learned the driver worked for UBER and was driving the back seat passenger to his residence. The backseat passenger was visibly nervous when interacting with the officers and made furtive movements during the encounter. Officers noted a backpack in the rear seat with the subject and requested additional units. While awaiting additional officers, the backseat passenger exited the vehicle and fled e on foot. A canine track was initiated, resulting in the locating of the passenger and his backpack. A search warrant for the backpack was applied for and granted. A search of the backpack yielded marijuana packaged for sale and various drug paraphernalia. The passenger was charged with violations of the Drug Act, including possession with the intent to deliver.

On December 19, 2022, a Collegeville resident was arrested and charged with deceptive business practices and related offenses. In early March of 2022, a Montgomery Township resident signed a contract with the subject to install a home generator for \$7,000.00. The subject never fulfilled the obligations of the contract. This subject had defrauded multiple victims and was the subject of several investigations in multiple jurisdictions in Montgomery County.

On December 31, 2022, officers responded to the Wegmans on Bethlehem Pike for a retail theft in progress. While responding, officers were advised that the subject left the area in a black Lexus with unpaid merchandise. Responding officers located the vehicle and made contact with the subject, who was making furtive movements in his vehicle and ignored officer commands. At one point, the subject began to walk toward officers aggressively, then turned away. Officers attempted to detain the subject, but he resisted and attempted to allude police. A struggle ensued, and an officer utilized his Taser to gain control of the subject. The suspect was safely taken into custody and medically cleared by responding paramedics. The subject was charged with retail theft and resisting arrest.

ITEMS OF INTEREST:

In conjunction with the holiday season, the Department facilitated several initiatives to help provide for those in our community. These included:

- Donating winter coats for the Montgomery County Winter Coat Drive.
- Participating in the Patty Simons Law Enforcement Food Drive's collection, packaging, and distribution event, along with eight volunteers from past Montgomery Township Citizen Police Academies.
- Delivering seventy-seven letters to the North Pole as part of the Santa's Mailbox Program.

Additionally, Montgomery Township employees, along with help from Lindinger's Deli, purchased gifts for twenty-one children, three single parents, and twenty-six senior citizens in our community.

In December, Officer Johnson attended Community Conversations meetings with North Penn High School students. These meetings are designed to break down barriers and engage in meaningful dialogue with students.

On December 28, 2022, members of the Department participated in the Police Athletic League Pickle Ball event at the Townships Community and Recreation Center.
