Stormwater Management

Please be mindful while washing your cars this summer.

Outdoor car washing is a standard summertime activity, but may lead to large amounts of dirt, road grime, oil, and heavy metals flowing into waterways.

The soapy water used to wash the car flows down the street and into storm drains. Water that enters storm drains travels directly to the nearest streams and creeks without being cleaned.

The best option to keep harmful chemicals from entering our streams is to go to a local car wash. Commercial car wash water is recycled and sent to the wastewater plant for treatment.

When washing your car at home, wash it on your lawn or a pervious (non-paved) surface, so the wash water can soak into the ground and pollutants will be filtered out. Use phosphorous-free soap to decrease the amount of nutrients entering our waterways. Excess nutrients decrease water quality and harm aquatic life.

The Administration Department focuses on delivering quality, reliable, customer-oriented services to Township residents. This department supports the Board of Supervisors and includes the offices of Public Information and Human Resources.

What's your background in government?

Prior to this position, I was the Manager for Plumstead Township in Central Bucks County for 11 years. I also worked as the Director of Finance for Lansdale Borough, and Accounting Manager for Upper Gwynedd Township.

What made you want to get involved with municipal government?

During my undergrad, I took a class called Government Accounting, where I got a little taste of what government work might be like. I then went onto work as an Internal Auditor for Montgomery County Community College, and realized I loved working for a community. I knew then that working in local government would be a great fit for me. In government, you have the chance to watch special projects come to fruition and benefit the community. Whether it be a park, special program, road improvement, etc., you are there from that first grant application, through Board approvals, to the birth of that special project. In government, your work can make a difference in the day-to-day life of your residents and community, and that's pretty awesome.



Definitely the diversity of the work. No two days are the same!

What advice would you give to someone who wants to work in government?

Following my MPA, Villanova asked me to speak to some students who were currently pursuing their Master of Public Administration. I told them- if you like to know what you're in for every day, local government is not for you, but if you want to have your hands in many things this is the level of government you want to be in. I think it's important for students interested in local government to speak to someone who works in local government, in the department in which they are interested in. If it's local enough, go to municipal meetings, and consider volunteering on a committee!

What are you most excited about in your new role here at Montgomery Township?

The newness of it! The challenges are going to be unique to this community and the people in it. It's also a professional reset for me, and I think that is important to do.





The Real Estate Tax Collector is independently elected and is responsible for collecting the Township's real estate tax and street light assessment (where applicable). The Real Estate Tax Collector also collects real

estate taxes for Montgomery County and the school taxes for North Penn School District.

Tax bills for the Township and County are combined and issued March 1 of every year. School district bills are issued July 1 of every year.





Credit card payment- Please note there is a 3% fee charged by the credit card processing company. To pay via credit card, visit www. officialpayments.com and follow the prompts, or call 1-800-2PAYTAX. The jurisdiction code is 4865. You will need to know your parcel number, the exact amount of tax payment, and the type of taxes you will be paying (Township/County, NPSD, Township/County Interim, NPSD interim).

The Local Services Tax is imposed upon each individual engaged in any occupation in the Township. It is the responsibility of the employer to deduct, from their employees, the tax of \$52 per year at a rate \$1 per week employed. An exemption is available for:

- Any person who earns less than \$12,000 in the calendar year and completes a low income exemption certificate
- Any person on active military duty during the taxing year, and
- Any current or former member of the military declared by the U.S. Veterans Administration to be 100% disabled.

The earned income/net profits tax requires that all persons living and working in the Township pay 1% on all individual gross earnings and net profits from businesses. This tax has been effective since January 1, 2003.

Finance Department

The Montgomery Township Finance Department has received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting awarded by the Government Finance Officers Association. This is the 9th consecutive year that the Finance Department has received this award. The Township received the certificate for the fiscal year ended December 2018.

To earn this certificate, the Finance Department has to prepare a comprehensive annual financial report showing the "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate the township's financial story and motivate potential users to read the report.

New Mail-in Ballot Option for Primary Election

Pennsylvania residents can now sign up online to vote by mail-in ballot for the Primary Election on June 2, without having to provide a reason.



The deadline to apply for a mail-in ballot is 5 p.m. on May 26. The deadline to return your completed mail-in ballot to the Montgomery County Election Office is 8 p.m. on Election Day.

You must be registered to vote in order to apply to vote by mail-in ballot.



Montgomery Township is working hard to keep the residents and community safe and informed as we all work through the impacts of COVID-19.


The Township urges you to continue practicing the social distancing recommendations made by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention and the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Montgomery Township Fire Department

As we near Memorial Day and July 4th, The Montgomery Township Fire Department would like to remind residents on the fireworks law, and how you can stay safe.


In October 2017, Pennsylvania passed new fireworks legislation. Residents can now legally purchase and use consumer-grade, or Class "C" fireworks that include firecrackers, roman candles, bottle rockets, and similar fireworks containing no more than 50 mg of explosive material. "Display fireworks," which are classified as including salutes that contain more than two grains or 130 milligrams of explosive materials, and professionalgrade aerial shells containing more than 60 grams of pyrotechnic compositions, are still only to be used by professionals with a permit from the municipality where the display will take place.

Please be aware of the following requirements for igniting fireworks:

- They cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without the express permission of the property owner
- They cannot be discharged from or within a motor vehicle or building
- They cannot be discharged toward a motor vehicle or building
- They cannot be discharged within 150 feet of an occupied structure
- They cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance, or another drug
- Display fireworks that contain more than 130 mg of explosive material and professional aerial shells may only be used by professionals and require a permit
- M-80's, cherry bombs, quarter-sticks, etc. are federally unlawful

Despite the law allowing their purchase, fireworks remain a dangerous explosive and must be handled carefully. Nationally, an average of 7 fireworks-related deaths occur each year, along with an estimated 11,100 injuries. If you choose to celebrate the holiday with lawful fireworks, please do so responsibly and carefully, and be considerate of your neighbors and their pets.

Call 911 immediately if you observe a violation of the law or wish to report a noise complaint.

Stop the Spotted Lanternfly

WHAT IS IT?

The Spotted Lanternfly (SLF), Lycorma Delicatula, is a destructive invasive plant, native to China, that was first detected in 2014 in southeastern Pennsylvania. It feeds voraciously on many plants, including economically important crops like fruit trees, grapevines, hops, hardwoods, and ornamentals. The Spotted Lanternfly's favored host, however, is the Tree-of-Heaven.



MANAGEMENT & QUARANTINE

In the spring, we are still in egg mass season, but soon, we will be entering hatching season! Follow the tips below to help stop the spread.

FALL, WINTER, AND SPRING

DESTROY EGG MASSES

Check for egg masses on trees, cement blocks, rocks, and any other hard surfaces. If you find egg masses, scrape them off using a plastic card or putty knife and then place the masses into a bag or container filled with rubbing alcohol or hand sanitizer. This is the most effective way to kill the eggs, but they can also be smashed or burned.

SPRING & SUMMER

BAND TREES

When the nymphs first hatch, they will walk up the trees to feed on the softer, new growth of the plant. Take advantage of this behavior by wrapping tree trunks in sticky tape and trapping the nymphs. Check the traps on a regular basis because, while rare, birds and small mammals can become stuck to the tape.

REMOVE TREE-OF-HEAVEN

While the spotted lanternfly will feast on a variety of plant species, they have a special fondness for Ailanthus, or tree-of-heaven, which is an invasive plant that is common in landscape plantings, agricultural areas, and along the sides of roads. For this reason, there is a current push from spotted lanternfly experts to remove this tree.

SPRING, SUMMER, AND FALL

USE INSECTICIDES

When used appropriately, insecticides can be a very effective and safe way to reduce lanternfly populations. The Penn State Extension is currently researching which insecticides are best for controlling the pest, but preliminary results show insecticides with the active ingredients dinotefuran, imidacloprid, carbaryl, and bifenthrin are most effective.

However, there are safety, environmental, and sometimes regulatory concerns that go along with the use of insecticides, so the Extension advises homeowners to do research, weigh the pros and cons, and seek professional advice if needed.

ALL YEAR

STOP THE SPREAD

To help stop the insect's spread, check your vehicle closely- undercarriages, windshield wipers, wheel wells, luggage racks, and such - for spotted lanternflies and egg masses before traveling in and out of the quarantine zone.

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


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Planning and Zoning Department

In the Planning & Zoning Department, it is our mission to preserve and improve the quality of life for residents and businesses within the community through the enforcement of the codes and ordinances of the Township; to be sensitive to the needs of the community while involved in planning and redevelopment; and to serve the community as we would ourselves.

Building permit applications are available on The Township's website at www. montgomerytwp.org and from the Planning and Zoning Office.

Common Projects That Need Permits

Montgomery Township requires building permits for any addition, alteration, demolition, replacement, or new construction prior to the start of any work including, but not limited to:

- Remodeling (kitchens, bathrooms, finished basements)
- Electric and Plumbing work
- Heating & Air Conditioning
- Roofing and Non-Vinyl Siding
- Hot Water Heaters

- (expansion tank required)
- Decks, Patios and Walkways
- Fences
- Fireplaces, Wood Stoves, Fire Pits, Chimneys
- Pergolas and Gazebos

- Sheds and Detached Garages
- Swimming pools and Hot Tubs / Spas
- Whole House Generators
- Solar Panels and Charging Stations
- Driveway Expansions

ADDITIONS, SHEDS, PATIOS, DECKS, SWIMMING POOLS.

There are setback requirements for these projects dependent upon the zoning district. Applications submitted require a site plan with measurements showing where the structures will be placed on the property.

FENCES

A new or replacement fence requires a permit. Fences cannot be placed directly on the property line. Applications submitted require a site plan with measurements showing where the fence will be placed on the property. The good side of the fence must face outward towards the neighboring property. There are specifications on height and types of fences permitted.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Montgomery Township would like to remind all residents the importance of keeping their trees and shrubs maintained, especially along sidewalks, streets and driveways. Trees and shrubs shall not have overhanging limbs onto the sidewalk area. A minimum clearance of 8 feet above the walking surface and a minimum 18 feet clearance above the street is required.

It's Mowing Season! Per Chapter 65 of the Code of Montgomery Township, property owners are responsible to keep grass and weeds maintained on a regular basis so as not to exceed 12 inches in height.

DRAINAGE / **STORMWATER MANAGEMENT.** Over the years, the drainage and the flow of water onto neighboring properties throughout our community has been a concern. Montgomery Township would like to remind residents to be courteous when handling drainage on their properties and not to redirect water onto neighboring properties, sidewalks, and streets. We request residents to consider the impact of pipes and drains from roofs, paved areas, and yards and that they are not being discharged in a manner that creates a nuisance. It is illegal for downspouts, floor drains, and sump pumps to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system.

Frequently Asked Ouestions:

How long does the permit process take? Plan reviews for residential permit applications typically take 2-3 weeks depending on volume. Please make sure the application and associated drawings are complete to help the review process.

Why am I submitting a curb escrow for my project?

Montgomery Township is one of the few municipalities responsible for the maintenance of the curb and sidewalk located in front of your home. Some projects require the property owner to submit \$1200.00 to the Township to be held in an escrow account until the completion of the project and an inspection of the curb and sidewalk to ensure there is no damage from the construction work. The fee is refunded typically within three weeks of the final inspection upon approval.

Do I need approval from my Homeowner's Association (HOA)?

Yes, a copy of the HOA approval must be submitted with the permit application for all exterior projects.

How do I schedule an inspection?
Each permit issued is supplied with a list of required inspections.
Please contact the Planning &
Zoning Office at 215-393-6920 to schedule at least 24-48 hours prior to the requested date.

How do I know where my property lines are located? The Planning & Zoning Office has site plans for most properties within the Township. While these site plans provide information, only a registered Civil Engineer or Surveyor can determine the exact location of your property lines and the locations of the buildings on your property.



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
















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
