A Message from the Chairwoman



Chairwoman Tanya Bamford

I hope this message finds you savoring the first signs of spring. With the weather turning milder, I encourage you to get outside and enjoy our beautiful parks and trails. Among the many lessons learned from the pandemic was how important exercise is for mental health, and how critical these outdoor areas are for offering spaces where our community can safely gather and recreate.

On that note, I am pleased to share that the Township received a grant of \$250,000 for improvements to Fellowship Park from the Community Conservation Partnerships Program administered by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR). The design phase is under way and construction is planned for 2023. Some of the enhancements will include an accessible play area, similar to the one in Friendship Park, with additional sensory play features for residents with special abilities. Other parks projects currently in the works include outdoor bocce courts and a new dog park.

As outlined in our Comprehensive Plan, investing in our parks and infrastructure are top priorities for the Township, which is why we took advantage of historically low interest rates to issue a \$15 million bond. These funds will pay for a variety of infrastructure improvements including the parks

improvements, road paving projects, and traffic signal replacement outlined in our five-year capital investment plan. I'm pleased to announce that we were given a AAA bond rating by S&P—the highest rating possible—which reflects their high opinion of our Township's financial management.

On the topic of finances, you probably noticed an increase in your real estate taxes. The Board of Supervisors approved the first increase in over a decade to generate the necessary funds not only for our capital improvement projects, but also to finance the debt service on the Community and Recreation Center and fund our Fire Department.

As you are aware, Montgomery Township's Fire Department is comprised of full-time career staff and volunteers. The cost to maintain fire services has increased substantially with the decline of volunteer firefighters, a problem the entire Commonwealth is experiencing. The additional tax revenue was necessary to retain our career staff and offer recruitment and retention incentives for our volunteers, including a stipend for those who cover for overnight calls.

In other news, the Township was saddened by the unexpected loss of Richard Roller, a long-time resident, former Supervisor, and valued volunteer. Our thoughts are with his family as they mourn his passing. Efforts are currently underway by the Shade Tree Commission to plant a tree in his memory at one of our parks. We will keep you posted with the details about the dedication ceremony when they become available.

On a happier note, we are pleased to share that our Planning and Zoning Department has been busier than ever issuing permits to businesses opening throughout the Township. One of the newest businesses to choose Montgomery Township is Shake Shack. They will be opening a new location at the Airport Square shopping center in the former Wendy's location. Watch for their grand opening soon and please be sure to give them a warm welcome to Montgomery Township!

A well overdue lab renovation for our local wastewater plant...





The lab at the Eureka Wastewater Treatment Plant (Eureka) is where the MTMSA staff performs various tests on the quality and integrity of the treatment process. Lab testing is crucial to proper treatment of wastewater to ensure the highest quality effluent is returned to the water cycle to contribute to the aquatic environment in our community.

While the staff at Eureka is highly skilled, the lab building was in much need of a renovation to bring the 1960s environment into the 21st century.

During the 2021 budget cycle, research was conducted for the various options currently available, and funds were budgeted for the lab renovation project which was to start in the 4th quarter of 2021 continuing into the 2022 fiscal year.

The lab is now completely renovated and reflects a clean, crisp, welcoming environment to match the

talented staff of MTMSA and the important work that is conducted in that space! We look forward to welcoming our next generation of staff members into our new lab.

MTMSA Leads the Community in COVID-19 Information

MTMSA was selected by the CDC to be a participant in the National Wastewater Surveillance System (NWSS). This is a new public health tool designed to monitor and assess COVID-19 spread. MTMSA is one of approximately 500 entities selected in the second round of participants who are joining the already 400 participants selected in the first round.



Sewage surveillance offers a preview of changes in the presence of COVID-19 in communities. SARS-CoV-2 is shed in the feces of individuals with symptomatic or asymptomatic infections, therefore revealing its presence regardless of symptoms or access to testing. Sewage testing has been successfully used as a method for early detection of other infectious diseases, including polio. Data that is collected by the authority for this program will be shared with LuminUltra Technologies who has partnered with the CDC and the Water Environment Federation (WEF) to assist with the wastewater analysis. Residents can view the results of this program across the country by visiting the CDC website at https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#wastewater-surveillance

MTMSA has successfully tracked the presence of COVID-19 in Montgomery Township throughout the pandemic by sampling and analyzing wastewater. MTMSA has communicated this information to the local school district as well as the Department of Health for the Commonwealth. The Board of MTMSA wants to assist the community in providing the data which gives leadership insight for decision making. The Board of MTMSA is excited to be on the forefront of advances in the use of wastewater in public health and looks forward to participating in these programs and conversations in the future.

New MTMSA Logo!

MTMSA was looking for an update to its identity. While a subsidiary of our fabulous Montgomery Township, MTMSA is a separate entity and wanted to provide ease of distinction for our residents to discern the difference between Township staff and MTMSA staff when out in the community. A logo of their own was needed.

The Board of MTMSA decided to look to our greater North Penn community for its new logo and reached out to the talented teachers and students at the North Montco Technical Career Center. The 11th and 12th grade students in the graphic design program rose to the challenge and submitted over a dozen logo choices for MTMSA. The board and staff narrowed the selection down to a Top Five Finalists list which then went to the public to cast their votes. Voting for the public was held in the MontCRC over the course of 3 days and a finalist was officially selected at the March 16th MTMSA public board meeting.

The Real Estate Tax Collector is independently elected and is responsible for collecting the Township's real estate tax and street light assessment (where applicable). The Real Estate Tax Collector also collects real estate taxes for Montgomery County and the school taxes for North Penn School District.

Tax bills for the Township and County are combined and issued March 1 of every year. School district bills are issued July 1 of every year.

Hours for tax collection and receipting of tax payments will be: - April 7, 14, 21, 26 (9 am to noon) and April 28 and June 30 (9am-noon and 4pm to 6pm) at the *Montgomery Township Bldg.*, (1001 Stump Road). If this is inconvenient, an appointment can be made by calling my office. If anything, other than a tax receipt is needed, please call my office ahead of time so the necessary documents, etc. can be brought for you. Tax payments as well as requests for Tax Certifications may be placed in a sealed envelope and dropped into a locked box outside the entrance to the Montgomery Township Police Dept (1001 Stump Road) at any time. Enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope and both copies of your tax bill and a receipt will be mailed to you.

In person collection is subject to change due to CDC guidelines. If there are changes, updates will be made to the Township website, Township weekly newsletter and Township cable channel news.

Acknowledging the 2022 Real Estate Tax Increase

The recent tax increase (the first in 15 years) was needed to provide revenue for several areas.

First, the Township has a fire department comprised of full-time career staff and volunteers. The cost to maintain fire services has increased with the decline of volunteer firefighters, a problem the entire Commonwealth is experiencing. We needed this additional revenue to retain our career staff and offer recruitment/retention incentives for our volunteers including a stipend for those who cover for overnight calls.

Second, the Township borrowed money at historically low-interest rates in 2021 to pay for a variety of infrastructure improvements including road paving projects, traffic signal replacement, and parks improvements outlined in our five-year capital investment plan. Our roads, traffic signals, playgrounds, and other Public Works equipment are aging and in some cases beyond the normal period for replacement. This borrowing will allow the Township to pay for the needs outlined in this plan which was presented to the Board of Supervisors as part of the last two budgets. Borrowing this money ensures that current and future residents who will

benefit from these improvements will share in the cost of them.

Finally, we are also using the additional revenue to establish a steady funding source for the outstanding debt service related to the construction of the Community and Recreation Center. This debt was refinanced in 2021, resulting in a \$1 million savings to taxpayers.

With regard to fiscal responsibility and management, our 2022 budget is actually slightly less than the prior year and as a result of the pandemic, several positions were evaluated and eliminated as well as some positions not filled when employees left. We continue to fully fund a 24/7 Police Department while some municipalities solely rely on State Police.

We want to assure you that every employee of the Township is fully aware of our responsibility when it comes to using taxpayer money. We strive to do our best with the resources we are trusted with.

The Board of Supervisors remains committed to providing essential services as well as quality-of-life amenities residents have come to expect.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS!

How do I get rid of small animals in my home or in my yard?

The Township does not capture small animals or remove animals from homes or private yards. Residents should call a local pest control company for assistance.

There is a dead deer on the street. How do I get it removed?

Montgomery Township Volunteer Committees


Volunteer Committees play a key role in helping maintain the quality of life in Montgomery Township. Residents can volunteer their time to help with Autumn Festival, review development plans, and offer expertise on environmental issues.

Autumn Festival Committee: The Autumn Festival Committee plans, organizes and implements the Montgomery Township Autumn Festival.

Business Development Partnership (BDP): The Business Development Partnership is a committee comprised of Montgomery Township business managers and owners. Each month the members of the BDP meet to discuss and analyze important matters that may affect the business community.

Community & Recreation Center Advisory Committee: The Community & Recreation Center Advisory Committee helps identify the needs of the Community & Recreation Center. The committee recommends recreational activities, programs, and policies.

Environmental Advisory Committee: The Montgomery Township EAC advises and educates the Board on matters of environmental importance to the community.



Human Relations Commission: The Montgomery Township Human Relations Commission (HRC) was established in 2021 to ensure that all who work or live in Montgomery Township and all visitors, are protected from unlawful discrimination.

Open Space Committee: The Committee is responsible for implementing the 2006 Open Space Plan along with continuing to explore future uses for existing preserved open space land.

Park and Recreation Board: The Park and Recreation Board strives to enhance the quality of life of the Township through ongoing management of open space, maintenance and improvement of existing park facilities and provision of a variety of recreational opportunities for residents.

Pension Fund Advisory Committee: The Pension Fund Advisory Committee is an advisory committee to the Board of Supervisors on matters regarding uniformed pension plan issues.

Planning Commission: The mission of the Planning Commission is to review subdivision and land development applications, ordinance revisions, and land use applications in order to make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.

Public Safety Committee: The Public Safety Committee is an advisory committee to the Board of Supervisors on all matters generally pertaining to public safety.

Ready for 100 Advisory Ad-Hoc Committee: The Ready for 100 Advisory Ad Hoc Committee was established for the purpose of drafting an energy transition plan for achieving the goals to include interim milestones, financial impacts, potential financing mechanisms, and other pertinent pieces of information the Board deems relevant to the Ready for 100 initiative.

Sewer Authority Board: The MTMSA Board oversees the Sewer Authority and its staff. The MTMSA operates Eureka Wastewater Treatment Plant and five pump stations, and maintains the entire sewer collection system in the Township.

Senior Volunteer Committee: The Senior Volunteer Committee works with Township Staff and the Board of Supervisors to help give a voice to the growing senior community in the Township.

Shade Tree Commission: The mission of the Shade Tree Commission is to preserve, protect, and replace the shade trees within Montgomery Township in order to maintain an ecological balance.

Zoning Hearing Board: The mission of the Zoning Hearing Board is to help assure fair and equitable application of the zoning ordinance by hearing appeals on the zoning officer's determinations and by granting relief from the literal enforcement of the ordinance in certain hardship situations.

During the project, your street will be closed except for local traffic and emergency vehicles. During the milling and paving of your street we are requiring that all cars be parked in their driveways. This will assist us in completing this project in a timely manner. Due to extreme temperatures of the material, it is recommended that you keep children and pets away from the street area where the paving process is taking place. Please avoid driving your vehicle on this material during the placement of blacktop or crack sealer material to avoid damage to your vehicle. We will not be held liable for any resulting damages.

Each property owner should check their mailbox front to ensure that it is a minimum of 7 inches behind the face of the curb, which is within federal postal regulations. Prior to the start of the paving project, the homeowner should reset any mailboxes protruding past the minimum measurement of 7 inches behind the face of the curb. This will ensure that the mailbox will not be damaged during the milling and paving operation. Any damage that may occur will be the responsibility of the homeowner

Please trim any trees or shrubs extending past the edge of the roadway or curb. This will allow our paving equipment to pass safely in front of your property. Montgomery Township will not be responsible for anything damaged in the right-of-way, such as invisible dog fencing, basketball backstops etc.

Defacing or writing in concrete will be treated as criminal mischief vandalism and will be handled by the Montgomery Township Police Department. Anyone that witness's vandalism is asked to please call the Police Department at (215) 362-2301.

Please trim any trees or shrubs extending past the edge of the roadway or curb. This will allow our contractor to easily access your property to make the necessary repairs. Montgomery Township will not be responsible for anything damaged in the right-of-way, such as invisible dog fencing, lawn sprinkler systems etc.





Christmas Tree Recycling

Did you know that Montgomery Township will recycle your Christmas tree? When you recycle your Christmas tree, it goes back into our Township parks. Montgomery Township would like to thank those who recycled their tree this past winter. Information about the 2022 Christmas Tree Recycling dates will be posted on our website and communication channels in December.



Single Use Battery Recycling:

Montgomery Township currently has two recycling collection centers for single-use batteries. Single-use batteries may be dropped off at the Township Building or the Community & Recreation Center.

Note: No lithium batteries will be accepted.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

This means Montgomery Township residents can mix everything together in the recycling bin, and then it is sorted at the recycling plant.

2022 Leaf & Yard Waste Collection



Montgomery Township has both a monthly leaf & yard waste drop-off collection and two curbside pick-up collections annually for Township Residents. **SORRY- NO GRASS CLIPPINGS!**

LEAF WASTE is defined as leaves, garden residues shrubbery and tree trimmings, and similar material, *but does not include grass clippings*.

YARD WASTE is defined as twigs, shrub trimmings, small branches, and like vegetative matter.

ALL MATERIALS FOR BOTH THE DROP-OFF AND THE CURBSIDE PICK-UP- MUST BE PLACED IN BROWN PAPER BIODEGRADABLE LEAF BAGS. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Leaf & Yard Waste Curbside Pick-up: There are two curbside pick-ups, one in the spring and one in the fall. Please have all of the leaf & yard waste placed in paper biodegradable leaf bags and out by the curb on the night before the pick-up.

SPRING CURBSIDE DATE: SATURDAY, APRIL 9, 2022 FALL CURBSIDE DATE: SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2022

Please have all of the leaf & yard waste placed in paper biodegradable leaf bags and out by the curb on the night before the pick-up. If the yard waste is not in a paper biodegradable bag, or does not fit in your paper biodegradable bag, we cannot take it.

Leaf & Yard Waste Monthly Drop-Off Collection: Held every month, usually on the third Saturday of the month. The collection takes place at the William F. Maule Park at Windlestrae, off Kenas Road from 8:00AM-Noon. Drop-offs are prohibited outside of this collection.

Stormwater Management

Please be mindful while washing your cars this summer.

Outdoor car washing is a standard summertime activity, but may lead to large amounts of dirt, road grime, oil, and heavy metals flowing into waterways.

The soapy water used to wash the car flows down the street and into storm drains. Water that enters storm drains travels directly to the nearest streams and creeks without being cleaned.

The best option to keep harmful chemicals from entering our streams is to go to a local car wash. Commercial car wash water is recycled and sent to the wastewater plant for treatment.

When washing your car at home, wash it on your lawn or a pervious (non-paved) surface, so the wash water can soak into the ground and pollutants will be filtered out. Use phosphorous-free soap to decrease the amount of nutrients entering our waterways. Excess nutrients decrease water quality and harm aquatic life.

Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC)

2021 Accomplishments

Hello all,

It's my pleasure to provide an update for the activities and accomplishments of Montgomery Township's EAC. The past year has been busy, to say the least, but we've been working diligently to make our Township a more sustainable place to live.

Last spring and into the summer, we made presentations on the importance of single use battery recycling. As most people normally throw old batteries in the trash, our Board of Supervisors approved two Battery Recycling stations for our residents - One at the Township Building entrance and the other at the Community Center entrance. To date, we've recycled and diverted over 600 pounds of single use batteries from landfills.

Over the summer, the EAC had conducted a Solar Energy Summit. During this virtual presentation, we provided education on resources for residents to research and potentially install solar panels for their homes or businesses.

Last fall, the EAC focused on presenting a virtual Weatherization Summit for our residents. This presentation highlighted the importance of insulating and air sealing your home.

For the remainder of the year, the EAC had researched the stormwater issues experienced by many residents. The rate in which we experience heavy rainfall, and "100-year" storms is dramatically increasing. This issue has driven our EAC to dedicate most of our schedule for 2022 to focus on storm water management and the steps we can take minimize damage to our properties. This year, we'll work to help residents to better understand rain gardens. The

EAC will work to provide resources on how to build rain gardens and where to purchase native, non-invasive plants.

Otherwise, we are looking at another busy year. The Township will offer an electronic recycling event and a tree giveaway. The Township is discussing ideas for additional environmental events. Throughout the year, you can participate in free hazardous waste collection events from Montgomery County.




Bark Park

Friendship Park

Amenities: Large open space parcel in center of residential cluster development.

Memorial Grove

Memorial Grove is a quiet and reflective area for all residents to remember loved ones.

The park was conceived following the tragic events of September 11, 2001 when a member of the Township Shade Tree Commission lost his son at the World Trade Center. In 2020, The Korean War Memorial America-Korea Alliance Peace Park was established next to Memorial Grove to honor the veterans who have served in Korea while deepening the ties between the Republic of Korea and the United States of America by providing a site for reflection and cultural activities.

This also helps reduce erosion, encourages infiltration, provides a valuable habitat for wildlife, slows floodwaters, filters out chemical pollutants and litter, and improves overall water quality)

Amenities: two playgrounds, three baseball fields, softball field, two soccer fields, picnic pavilion (electricity available), restrooms (near pavilion), paved jogging/biking loop by baseball fields (2,287 feet or slightly less than ½ mile), paved trail from baseball fields to tennis courts (1,604 feet or slightly less than 1/3 mile), four tennis courts with lights, two basketball courts with lights, street hockey court with lights, sand volleyball court, paved parking lots, and two large naturalized basins.

One Mind Campaign - A Commitment to Mental Health

The Montgomery Township Police Department and Chief J. Scott Bendig are pleased to announce that they have completed a pledge they took to improve their response to those suffering from mental illness in their community. The pledge is part of an initiative called the One Mind Campaign started by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP).

In completing the One Mind Pledge, the Montgomery Township Police Department established a sustainable partnership with a local mental health organization, developed and implemented a model policy to address officers' interactions with those affected by mental



illness, and ensured that all of their officers received mental health awareness training, with over 40 percent of the department completing the more intensive Crisis Intervention Specialist training.



The most significant benefit in adopting all the strategies of the One Mind Campaign pledge has been an increased overall awareness in understanding how better to deal with and help those suffering from mental illness within our community.

With the completion of this pledge, the Montgomery Township Police Department becomes only the fourth (and the largest) agency in the Commonwealth to complete this initiative, and the first in Montgomery County.

The Montgomery Township Board of Supervisors congratulates the officers of the Montgomery Township Police Department for their successful completion of the One Mind Campaign and commend Chief J. Scott Bendig for his commitment to this mental health initiative and for constantly striving to position this Police Department to continue to be at the forefront in law enforcement.

Community Services Offered to Residents and Businesses

Car Seat Checks

The Montgomery Township Police Department provides residents with the opportunity to receive instruction on the proper method and procedure for installing children's car seats. This service is provided by Department personnel certified in Child Passenger Safety.

Canine Demonstrations

The Montgomery Township Police Department Canine Unit provides demonstrations to school and civic groups. During these demonstrations the handlers introduce the canines to the public and demonstrate the abilities of canine for law enforcement.

Citizens Police Academy

Members of the police department in conjunction with the Community Policing Unit conduct an annual Citizens Police Academy consisting of a ten-week program that is designed to educate the community about the operations of the Police Department.

Child Fingerprinting

The Montgomery Township Police Department will provide parents/guardians with the opportunity to have their children fingerprinted and photographed for identification purposes. Upon completion, residents are provided with a copy of their child's fingerprints and photograph.

Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE)

DARE is a police officer-led series of classroom lessons that teaches children at the elementary education level how to resist peer pressure and live productive drug and violence-free lives. Members of the Department presented the DARE program to over 200 5th grade students at Bridle Path Elementary, Montgomery Elementary, and Mary, Mother of the Redeemer School.

Junior Police Academy

Since 1998, the Montgomery Township Police Department has sponsored an annual Junior Police Academy as a way for officers to foster positive relationships with children in our community and introduce them to a wide variety of careers within the emergency services field.



National Night Out

National Night Out is a community-police awareness-raising event held on the first Tuesday of August to promote involvement in crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships, and neighborhood camaraderie. In 2014, Montgomery Township's National Night Out was held at Target in the Montgomery Square Shopping Center. Activities include various demonstrations by emergency service personnel, giveaways, food, and prizes.

Prescription Drug Drop-off

The department participates in Montgomery County's Prescription Drug Disposal Program in order to help provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the community about the potential for abuse of medications. Unwanted prescription drugs can be dropped of to the designated drop-off box located in the Police Department lobby 24/7.

Police Week Celebration

In 1962, President Kennedy declared the 3rd week of May as Police Week, paying special recognition to law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty for the safety and protection of others.

The Montgomery Township Police Department conducts a one-day celebration that includes child fingerprinting, giveaways, equipment displays, and demonstrations by our Canine Unit.

Security Surveys

As a service to our residents and business community the Montgomery Township Police Department provides a Security Survey at no cost. The Survey addresses ways to improve the physical security of your property, discuss crime prevention strategies and collect emergency contact information.

Station Tours

Montgomery Township Police Department welcomes civic and student groups to tour our police station. Tours learn about the responsibilities of the station, Department personnel, and learn about some of the equipment the officers carry. Tours are offered by appointment only.

Public Seminars

As a service to our community the Montgomery Township Police Department provides public seminars to address pressing issues and concerns relative to topics and trends in law enforcement.

Planning & Zoning Department



In the Planning & Zoning Department, it is our mission to preserve and improve the quality of life for residents and businesses within the community through the enforcement of the codes and ordinances of the Township, to be sensitive to the needs of the community while involved in planning and redevelopment, *and to serve the community as we would ourselves*.

Common Projects That Need Permits

Montgomery Township requires building permits for any addition, alteration, demolition, replacement, or new construction prior to the start of any work including, but not limited to:

- Remodeling (Kitchens, bathrooms, basements, etc.)
- Electric and Plumbing Work
- Heating & Air Conditioning (new & replacement units)
- Roofing and Non-Vinyl Siding
- Hot Water Heaters (expansion tank required)
- Decks, Patios and Walkways
- Fences

- Fireplaces, Wood Stoves, Fire Pits, Chimneys
- Pergolas and Gazebos
- Sheds and Detached Garages
- Swimming pools and Hot Tubs / Spas
- Whole House Generators
- Solar Panels and Charging Stations
- Driveway Expansions

ADDITIONS, ROOF STRUCTURES, SHEDS, PATIOS, DECKS, SWIMMING POOLS, GENERATORS.

There are setback requirements for these projects dependent upon the zoning district. Applications submitted require a site plan with measurements showing where the structures will be placed on the property.

FENCES.

A new or replacement fence requires a permit. Fences cannot be placed directly on the property line, a minimum of two inches within is recommended. Applications submitted require a site plan with measurements showing where the fence will be placed on the property. The good side of the fence must face outward towards the neighboring property. There are also specific requirements for corner properties, heights of fences, and types of fences.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

In Montgomery Township, the minimum property standards are enforced by the Planning & Zoning Department on a complaint and observation basis. The Township expects all residents and business owners to take responsibility for properly maintaining their property and doing their part to keep safe, clean, and attractive properties. The most common concerns include accumulation of rubbish and debris, grass and weeds, and the maintenance and clearance of sidewalks. Please remember to take care of your trees and shrubs to avoid overhanging limbs onto the sidewalk area. All private sidewalks (including those in the side and rear yards) are to be cleared within 24 hours after a snowfall.

It's Mowing Season!

Per Chapter 65 of the Code of Montgomery Township, property owners are responsible to keep grass and weeds maintained on a regular basis so as not to exceed 12 inches in height.

DRAINAGE / STORMWATER MANAGEMENT.

Over the years, the drainage and the flow of water onto neighboring properties throughout our community has been a concern. Montgomery Township would like to remind residents to be courteous when handling drainage on their properties and not to redirect water onto neighboring properties, sidewalks, and streets. We request residents to consider the impact of pipes and drains from roofs, paved areas, and yards and that they are not being discharged in a manner that creates a nuisance. It is illegal for downspouts, floor drains, and sump pumps to be discharged into the sanitary sewer system.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How long does the permit process take? Plan reviews for residential permit applications typically take 2-3 weeks depending on volume. Please make sure the application and associated drawings are complete in order to ensure the review process is timely.

Do I need approval from my Homeowner's Association (HOA)? Yes, a copy of the HOA approval must be submitted with the permit application for all exterior projects.

How do I schedule an inspection? Each permit issued is supplied with a list of required inspections. Please contact the Planning & Zoning Office at 215-393-6920 to schedule the inspection at least 24-48 hours prior to the requested date.

How do I know where my property lines are located? The Planning & Zoning Office has site plans for most properties within the Township provided by the developer upon initial construction.

While these site plans provide information, only a registered Civil Engineer or Surveyor can determine the exact location of your property lines and the locations of the buildings on your property.

Do I need a permit to open a business in the Township? Yes, a Non-Residential Use & Occupancy permit application must be submitted to the Planning & Zoning Office prior to the opening of any business within the Township. We recommend contacting the Township first to determine if the proposed business / use complies with the regulations at the desired location.

Do I need a permit to operate a business from my home? Yes, the Township's Zoning ordinance provides criteria for operating a home occupation. Although certain home occupations are permitted, many are not, and there are regulations to be followed, including the requirement to apply for and obtain a permit.


Mobile Food Vendors

Montgomery Township allows mobile food vendors to operate in the Township within certain parameters and with the proper permits. The Department of Fire Services is going to be going door to door offering free smoke alarm installations in Township neighborhoods on the weekends in the Spring and Summer. The schedule of neighborhoods will be based on various demographics, and lawn signs will be placed in each neighborhood notifying residents as their designated weekend approaches. Residents may also call the office to schedule a smoke alarm installation. The program includes smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, and lighted strobe alarms to serve residents who are deaf and hard of hearing. The distribution includes a home safety fire check and registration for ReadyMontco, which is our emergency notification system.
